COMMITTEE REPORT

MADAM PRESIDENT:

The Senate Committee on Rules and Legislative Procedure, to which was referred Senate Bill No. 113, has had the same under consideration and begs leave to report the same back to the Senate with the recommendation that said bill be AMENDED as follows:

1	Delete the title and insert the following:
2	A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning
3	transportation.
4	Delete everything after the enacting clause and insert the
5	following:
6	SECTION 1. IC 8-3-23 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE AS
7	A NEW CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
8	1, 2021]:
9	Chapter 23. Indiana Passenger Rail Commission
10	Sec. 1. The following are the purposes of this chapter:
11	(1) The facilitation of development and implementation of
12	improvements to intercity passenger rail service in Indiana
13	and the Midwest.
14	(2) The coordination of interaction among federal, state, and
15	local elected officials relating to passenger rail issues.
16	(3) The facilitation of development and implementation of
17	long range plans for modern passenger rail service ir
18	Indiana and the Midwest.
19	(4) The coordination of the public and private sectors at the
20	federal, state, and local levels to ensure cooperation among
21	the various entities having an interest in passenger rai
22	service and to promote Indiana interests regarding
23	passenger rail service.
24	(5) The facilitation of the efforts of the department and other
25	transportation agencies involved in developing and
26	implementing passenger rail service in Indiana and the

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1 Midwest. 2 Sec. 2. As used in this chapter, "commission" refers to the 3 Indiana passenger rail commission established by section 4 of this 4 chapter. 5 Sec. 3. As used in this chapter, "department" refers to the Indiana department of transportation established by IC 8-23-2-1. 6 7 Sec. 4. The Indiana passenger rail commission is established. 8 Sec. 5. The commission is a separate body, corporate and 9 politic, which though separate from the state, performs essential 10 governmental functions. Sec. 6. (a) The commission consists of the following members: 11 (1) The commissioner of the department, or the 12 commissioner's designee. The commissioner or the 13 commissioner's designee may not serve as the representative 14 of any of the organizations described in subdivisions (2) 15 through (5). 16 (2) Two (2) representatives of the Indiana Passenger Rail 17 Alliance. 18 19 (3) Two (2) representatives of the Northern Indiana 20 **Commuter Transportation District.** (4) Two (2) representatives of the Northern Indiana 21 22 Passenger Rail Association. (5) Two (2) representatives of any other entity determined by 23 24 the commission to be appropriate for representation on the 25 commission. (b) The commissioner of the department serves by virtue of the 26 commissioner's office. The commissioner may designate an 27 28 individual to represent the commissioner as a member of the 29 commission. An individual designated by the commissioner to 30 represent the commissioner serves until the earlier of the following: 31 (1) The commissioner designates another individual to 32 represent the commissioner. 33 (2) The individual who designated the individual no longer 34 35 holds the office of commissioner. (c) Each entity named in subsection (a)(2) through (a)(4) and 36 any entity granted representation on the commission under 37 subsection (a)(5) shall appoint its representatives as provided in the 38 39 bylaws of the entity. (d) A commission member must be a resident of Indiana. 40 (e) A commission member serves without compensation. 41 (f) The commission may grant an entity representation on the 42 43 commission by a resolution adopted by a majority of the existing commission members. 44 45 Sec. 7. (a) The commission shall elect the following officers from among its members as provided in the commission's bylaws: 46 47 (1) A chair. (2) A vice chair. 48 49 (3) A treasurer.

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(4) A secretary.

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1	(b) The officers elected under subsection (a) shall perform the
2	functions and exercise the powers stated in the commission's
3	bylaws for each officer.
4	Sec. 8. (a) The commission shall meet at least quarterly in each
5	calendar year and at other times as determined by the commission.
6	(b) The commission shall conduct its business in accordance
7	with the procedures and voting rights specified in the commission's
8	bylaws.
9	Sec. 9. The commission shall do the following:
0	(1) Coordinate with Indiana's long term plan for modern
1	passenger rail service implementation.
2	(2) Advocate for the funding and authorization necessary to
3	make the long term plan for passenger rail service a reality
4	for Indiana.
5	(3) Identify and develop ways for the commission to form
6	partnerships, including with the rail industry and labor, to
7	implement improved passenger rail service in Indiana and
8	the Midwest.
9	(4) Cooperate with other agencies, regions, and entities to
0.	ensure that Indiana is adequately represented and integrated
1	into national and regional plans for passenger rail
.2	development.
.3	(5) Adopt bylaws governing the following:
.4	(A) The commission's activities and procedures.
2.5	(B) The powers and duties of the commission's officers.
26	(C) The terms and appointment of commission
.7	members.
28	(D) The voting rights of commission members.
.9	(E) The voting procedures of the commission.
0	(F) The conducting of commission business.
1	(G) Other matters necessary to fulfill the commission's
2	duties.
3	(6) Receive and expend money to carry out the commission's
4	powers and duties.
5	(7) Publish an annual report about the commission's
6	activities.
7	Sec. 10. The commission may do any of the following:
8	(1) Provide Indiana and multistate advocacy necessary to
9	implement passenger rail systems or plans as approved by
0	the commission.
1	(2) Raise the visibility of modern passenger rail service
2	benefits and needs by working with elected officials,
3	economic development and planning agencies, the private
4	sector, and other such entities.
5	(3) Educate federal, state, and local elected officials and the
6	public on the advantages of passenger rail service to:
.7	(A) enhance the environment;
8	(B) provide an economic development driver; and
.9	(C) serve as an integral part of an intermodal
0	transportation system in Indiana and the Midwest.

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1	(4) Make recommendations to the general assembly, the
2	governor, and the department.
3	(5) Investigate and encourage the securing of grants and
4	other funding to underwrite modern passenger rail service
5	throughout Indiana and the Midwest.
6	(6) Establish an office and hire staff as necessary.
7	(7) Contract for or provide services.
8	(8) Conduct research.
9	(9) Establish committees.
10	Sec. 11. (a) The commission may accept, for any of its purposes
11	and functions, donations, gifts, grants, and appropriations of
12	money, equipment, supplies, materials, and services from any
13	federal, state, or local government entity or from any private legal
14	person.
15	(b) All expenses incurred by the commission in performing the
16	duties given to the commission under this chapter shall be paid by
17	the commission from money available to it.
18	(c) The commission may not borrow money or issue any debt
19	instrument.
