Your Committee on <u>Public Policy</u>, to which was referred <u>Senate Bill 144</u>, has had the same under consideration and begs leave to report the same back to the House with the recommendation that said bill **be amended** as follows:

1	Page 1, delete lines 1 through 17.
2	Page 2, delete lines 1 through 2.
3	Page 2, after line 22, begin a new paragraph and insert:
4	"SECTION 2. IC 7.1-3-27-6, AS AMENDED BY P.L.285-2019,
5	SECTION 47, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
6	JULY 1, 2021]: Sec. 6. (a) A holder of an artisan distiller's permit may
7	also hold:
8	(1) one (1) or more farm winery permits; or
9	(2) one (1) or more brewer's permits issued under IC 7.1-3-2-2(b).
10	or
11	(3) one (1) or more distiller's permit under IC 7.1-3-7.
12	(b) A holder of an artisan distiller's permit may hold a beer retailer's
13	permit, a wine retailer's permit, or a liquor retailer's permit for a

1 restaurant.

2	(c) A holder of an artisan distiller's permit may also hold a
3	distiller's permit under IC 7.1-3-7.
4	SECTION 3. IC 7.1-3-27-16 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
5	AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
6	1, 2021]: Sec. 16. (a) This section applies only to the holder of an
7	artisan distiller's permit that also holds an interest in a distiller's
8	permit under IC 7.1-3-7.
9	(b) Subject to the requirements in subsections (c) and (d), a
10	holder of an artisan distiller's permit that also holds an interest in
11	a distiller's permit may manufacture and bottle liquor on the same
12	equipment on the premises of the artisan distillery.
13	(c) A holder must store liquor manufactured or bottled under
14	subsection (b) under an artisan distiller's permit in an area
15	separate and distinct at all times from the liquor manufactured
16	under a distiller's permit.
17	(d) The manufacture, bottling, and storage of liquor under this
18	section must conform with federal laws, rules, and regulations.".
19	Renumber all SECTIONS consecutively.
