## **COMMITTEE REPORT**

Your Committee on <u>Public Health</u>, to which was referred <u>Senate Bill 202</u>, has had the same under consideration and begs leave to report the same back to the House with the recommendation that said bill be amended as follows:

Page 2, between lines 1 and 2, begin a new paragraph and insert:

- 2 "SECTION 3. IC 16-21-2-15.7 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA 3 CODE AS A **NEW** SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS 4 [EFFECTIVE UPON PASSAGE]: **Sec. 15.7. (a) As used in this**
- 5 section, "facility" includes the following:
- 6 (1) A hospital licensed under this article.
- 7 (2) A freestanding rehabilitation hospital.
- 8 (3) A private psychiatric hospital licensed under IC 12-25.
- 9 **(4)** An ambulatory outpatient surgical center licensed under this article.
- 11 (b) Subject to subsections (c), (d), and (f), a facility shall allow
- visitation to a patient who has been admitted as a patient during a

| 4  | (1) A patient's family member.   |
| 5  | (2) A patient's legal representative.                                  |

| 7  | (4) A member of the clergy.  |
| 8  | (5) An essential caregiver.  |
| 9  | (6) Any other individual capable of meeting the patient's              |
| 10 | needs.   |
| 11 | (c) Subject to subsection (d), a person described in subsection        |
| 12 | (b) shall be permitted to daily visit a person who is admitted as a    |
| 13 | patient without regard for any visitation restrictions imposed by      |
| 14 | the facility during a compassionate care situation that involves one   |
| 15 | (1) or more of the following scenarios:                                |
| 16 | (1) An end of life situation, including hospice.                       |
| 17 | (2) A patient who is experiencing weight loss or dehydration           |
| 18 | and is in need of cuing or encouragement for eating or                 |
| 19 | drinking.  |
| 20 | (3) A patient who is experiencing emotional distress,                  |
| 21 | depression, or grief.  |
| 22 | (4) A patient who is diagnosed with Alzheimer's disease,               |
| 23 | dementia, or a related cognitive disorder.                             |
| 24 | (5) The patient is experiencing an acute health situation that         |
| 25 | requires immediate attention.  |
| 26 | (6) The patient is undergoing surgery with general anesthesia.         |
| 27 | (7) The patient is experiencing a sudden deterioration in the          |
| 28 | patient's medical condition.   |
| 29 | (8) The patient is unable to provide or does not know                  |
| 30 | pertinent and critical medical information that would aid the          |
| 31 | health care professional in treating the patient.                      |
| 32 | (9) The patient is a minor.  |
| 33 | (d) A person who is described in subsection (b) or who visits a        |
| 34 | patient admitted as a patient for a reason specified in subsection (c) |
| 35 | must comply with the following:  |
| 36 | (1) Applicable guidelines concerning disease control or                |
| 37 | prevention as determined by the Centers for Medicare and               |
| 38 | Medicaid Services or the Centers for Disease Control and               |

| 2  | (2) Any facility requirements to undergo screening or to               |
| 3  | complete testing before visiting a patient admitted as a               |
| 4  | patient. If a screening protocol or test result prohibits a            |
| 5  | person from visiting the patient, another individual capable           |
| 6  | of successfully completing or passing the applicable screening         |
| 7  | protocol or test may be selected for visitation by the patient.        |
| 8  | (3) Limitations that an individual granted access under the            |
| 9  | protocols of this section may not access any area other than           |
| 10 | the patient's room or area designated or permitted by the              |
| 11 | facility.  |
| 12 | (e) The facility may specify any requirement that the facility will    |
| 13 | implement for the individual who is granted access to the facility,    |
| 14 | including the following:   |
| 15 | (1) Screening.   |
| 16 | (2) Personal protective equipment requirements and                     |
| 17 | instructions on the proper use of the equipment.                       |
| 18 | (3) Restrictions when entering patient rooms.                          |
| 19 | (4) Disclosure of any risks associated with the individual's           |
| 20 | entry onto the premises, including risks during an epidemic or         |
| 21 | when a communicable disease is involved.                               |
| 22 | (5) Written acknowledgment from the individual entering the            |
| 23 | premises that the individual:  |
| 24 | (A) will follow the established protocols;                             |
| 25 | (B) holds the facility, its employees, and health care                 |
| 26 | providers harmless for being allowed to enter the facility;            |
| 27 | and  |
| 28 | (C) received and acknowledges the disclosure of the risks              |
| 29 | described in subdivision (4).  |
| 30 | (f) Nothing in this section may be construed to prevent a facility     |
| 31 | from limiting the number of designated individuals that a person       |
| 32 | admitted as a patient may see if the limitations are explicitly        |
| 33 | required under a disaster emergency or public health emergency         |
| 34 | declaration.   |
| 35 | (g) A facility, its employees, and contractors that in good faith      |
| 36 | implement protocols in compliance with this section are not civilly    |
| 37 | liable for an individual being allowed to enter the facility under the |
| 38 | protocols unless the action constitutes gross negligence or willful    |

| 1 | or wanton misconduct.".  |
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| 2 | Page 6, between lines 19 and 20, begin a new paragraph and insert: |
| 3 | "SECTION 6. IC 34-30-2-66.1 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA                |
| 4 | CODE AS A <b>NEW</b> SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS                    |
| 5 | [EFFECTIVE UPON PASSAGE]: Sec. 66.1. IC 16-21-2-15.7               |
| 6 | (Concerning facility protocols on admittance of visitors into the  |
| 7 | facility).".   |
| 8 | Renumber all SECTIONS consecutively.                               |
