<u>Summary of Legislation:</u> This bill prohibits the use of corporal punishment on certain students. It allows the use of reasonable and necessary force in certain situations.

Effective Date: July 1, 2025.

Explanation of State Expenditures: Department of Education: This bill requires the Department of Education to adopt rules prohibiting state-accredited nonpublic schools from using corporal punishment. This requirement is within the routine administrative function of the department and should be implemented within existing resources.

Explanation of State Revenues:
