### HOUSE BILL No. 1041

### DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 21-18-13.5; IC 34-30-2.1-292.5.

Synopsis: Student eligibility in interscholastic sports. Requires, for purposes of interscholastic athletic events, state educational institutions, private postsecondary educational institutions, and certain athletic associations to expressly designate an athletic team or sport as one of the following: (1) A male, men's, or boys' team or sport. (2) A female, women's, or girls' team or sport. (3) A coeducational or mixed team or sport. Prohibits a male, based on the student's biological sex at birth in accordance with the student's genetics and reproductive biology, from participating on an athletic team or sport designated as being a female, women's, or girls' athletic team or sport. Requires certain out-of-state athletic teams to provide notice to specified individuals if the out-of-state team allows a male student to compete in Indiana against an athletic team or sport designated as a female, women's, or girls' team or sport. Requires state educational institutions, certain private postsecondary educational institutions, and certain athletic associations to establish grievance procedures for a violation of these provisions. Establishes a civil action for a violation of these provisions. Provides that state educational institutions, certain private postsecondary educational institutions, and certain athletic associations are not subject to liability in a civil, administrative, disciplinary, or criminal action for acting in compliance with these provisions.

Effective: July 1, 2025.

## **HOUSE BILL No. 1041**

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning higher education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

4	Sec. 2. As used in this chapter, "association" has the meaning set

6	Sec. 3. (a) A state educational institution, private postsecondary
7	educational institution, or association that organizes, sanctions, or
8	sponsors an athletic team or sport described in section 1 of this
9	chapter shall expressly designate the athletic team or sport as one
10	(1) of the following:
11	(1) A male, men's, or boys' team or sport.
12	(2) A female, women's, or girls' team or sport.

14	(b) A male, based on a student's biological sex at birth in

24	provide notice concerning the student's biological sex and intent to
25	compete at least sixty (60) days before any competition taking place

27	(b) The notice described in subsection (a) must be provided to:
