

HOUSE BILL No. 1051

DIGEST OF HB 1051 (Updated January 14, 2025 9:20 am - DI 140)

Citations Affected: IC 16-31.

Synopsis: Mobile integration healthcare grants. Provides that an emergency medical services provider agency that is operated by a county is eligible for a mobile integration healthcare grant.

Effective: July 1, 2025.

HOUSE BILL No. 1051

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning health.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. IC 16-31-12-4, AS AMENDED BY P.L.156-2020,

2	SECTION 67, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3	JULY 1, 2025]: Sec. 4. (a) The commission may establish a mobile
4	integration healthcare grant to assist communities in the development
5	and implementation of a mobile integrated healthcare program that has
6	been approved by the commission under this chapter.
7	(b) The commission may do the following:
8	(1) Administer the grant.
9	(2) Create a grant application for the grant.
0	(3) Develop a process for receiving and evaluating grant
1	applications.
2	(4) Establish eligibility requirements for the grant.
3	(5) Select recipients of the grant and distribute the funds for an
4	awarded grant.
5	(c) The commission may only award a grant under this section to an
6	emergency medical services provider agency that is operated by a:
7	(1) city;



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- (2) town; or(3) township; or(4) county.
