DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: Noncode.

Synopsis: Funding for public safety training. Appropriates \$2,000,000 from the state general fund to the department of homeland security (department) to be used by the department for the purpose of providing mental health and wellness training for: (1) law enforcement officers; (2) emergency medical services providers; and (3) full-time firefighters.

Effective: July 1, 2025.

A BILL FOR AN ACT concerning public safety and to make an appropriation.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

- 1 SECTION 1. [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2025] (a) **There is**
2 **appropriated from the state general fund to the department of**
3 **homeland security two million dollars (\$2,000,000) for the**
4 **biennium beginning July 1, 2025, and ending June 30, 2027, for the**
5 **purpose of providing mental health and wellness training for:**
6 **(1) law enforcement officers;**
7 **(2) emergency medical services providers; and**
8 **(3) full-time firefighters.**
9 **(b) This SECTION expires June 30, 2027.**
