Synopsis: Contracting for preschool programs. Removes language restricting school corporations from entering into a contract with a religiously affiliated nonprofit preschool program.

Effective: July 1, 2025.

HOUSE BILL No. 1102

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 20-20-28-5, AS AMENDED BY P.L.233-2015,
2	SECTION 42, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3	JULY 1, 2025]: Sec. 5. A school corporation may enter into an
4	agreement with a nonprofit corporation to provide early childhood
5	education programs, preschool programs, or latch key programs.
6	However, if a school corporation enters into a contract for a preschool
7	program, the nonprofit corporation
8	(1) must operate a federally approved preschool program. and
9	(2) may not be religiously affiliated.
