Synopsis: Consent for engaging in sexual activity. Requires an accredited school, when providing instruction on human sexuality, to emphasize the necessity of obtaining consent from the other individual involved before engaging in any type of sexual activity.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

2	SECTION 14, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3	JULY 1, 2016]: Sec. 13. (a) Throughout instruction on human sexuality
4	or sexually transmitted diseases, an accredited school shall:
5	(1) require a teacher to teach abstinence from sexual activity
6	outside of marriage as the expected standard for all school age
7	children;
8	(2) include in the instruction that abstinence from sexual activity
9	is the only certain way to avoid out-of-wedlock pregnancy,
10	sexually transmitted diseases, and other associated health
11	problems; and
12	(3) include in the instruction that the best way to avoid sexually
13	transmitted diseases and other associated health problems is to
14	establish a mutually faithful monogamous relationship in the
15	context of marriage.
16	(b) When providing instruction on human sexuality under

subsection (a), an accredited school shall emphasize the necessity
