# **HOUSE BILL No. 1109**

#### DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 6-2.5-5-39.

**Synopsis:** Sales tax on recreational vehicles. Provides that the purchase of a recreational vehicle or cargo trailer that is transported out of Indiana for registration and use in another state or country is exempt from the state gross retail tax regardless of whether the destination state or country provides a similar exemption for Indiana residents.

Effective: July 1, 2014.

### **HOUSE BILL No. 1109**

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning taxation.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 6-2.5-5-39, AS AMENDED BY P.L.211-2007,
2	SECTION 15, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3	JULY 1, 2014]: Sec. 39. (a) As used in this section, "cargo trailer"
4	means a vehicle:
5	(1) without motive power;
6	(2) designed for carrying property;
7	(3) designed for being drawn by a motor vehicle; and
8	(4) having a gross vehicle weight rating of at least two thousand
9	two hundred (2,200) pounds.
10	(b) As used in this section, "recreational vehicle" means a vehicle
11	with or without motive power equipped exclusively for living quarters
12	for persons traveling upon the highways. The term includes a travel
13	trailer, a motor home, a truck camper with a floor and facilities
14	enabling it to be used as a dwelling, and a fifth wheel trailer.
15	(c) A transaction involving a cargo trailer or a recreational vehicle

is exempt from the state gross retail tax if:

1	(1) the purchaser is a nonresident;
2	(2) upon receiving delivery of the cargo trailer or recreational
3	vehicle, the person transports it within thirty (30) days to a
4	destination outside Indiana;
5	(3) the cargo trailer or recreational vehicle will be titled or
6	registered for use in another state or country; and
7	(4) the cargo trailer or recreational vehicle will not be titled or
8	registered for use in Indiana. <del>and</del>
9	(5) the cargo trailer or recreational vehicle will be titled or
10	registered in a state or country that provides an exemption from
11	sales, use, or similar taxes imposed on a cargo trailer or
12	recreational vehicle that is purchased in that state or country by
13	an Indiana resident and will be titled or registered in Indiana.
14	A transaction involving a cargo trailer or recreational vehicle that does
15	not meet the requirements of subdivision (5) is not exempt from the
16	state gross retail tax.
17	(d) A purchaser must claim an exemption under this section by
18	submitting to the retail merchant an affidavit stating the purchaser's
19	intent to:
20	(1) transport the cargo trailer or recreational vehicle to a
21	destination outside Indiana within thirty (30) days after delivery;
22	and
23	(2) title or register the cargo trailer or recreational vehicle for use
24	in another state or country.
25	The department shall prescribe the form of the affidavit, which must
26	include an affirmation by the purchaser under the penalties for perjury
27	that the information contained in the affidavit is true. The affidavit
28	must identify the state or country in which the cargo trailer or
29	recreational vehicle will be titled or registered.
30	(e) The department shall provide the information necessary to
31	determine a purchaser's eligibility for an exemption claimed under this
32	section to retail merchants in the business of selling cargo trailers or
33	recreational vehicles.
34	SECTION 2. [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2014] (a) IC 6-2.5-5-39, as
35	amended by this act, applies only to retail transactions occurring
36	after June 30, 2014.
37	(b) Except as provided in subsection (c), a retail transaction is
38	considered to have occurred after June 30, 2014, if the property
39	whose transfer constitutes selling at retail is delivered to the
40	purchaser or to the place of delivery designated by the purchaser
41	after June 30, 2014.
42	(c) Notwithstanding the delivery of the property constituting



1	selling at retail after June 30, 2014, a transaction is considered to
2	have occurred before July 1, 2014, to the extent that:
3	(1) the agreement of the parties to the transaction is entered
4	into before July 1, 2014; and
5	(2) payment for the property furnished in the transaction is
6	made before July 1, 2014.
7	(d) This SECTION expires January 1, 2015.
