### HOUSE BILL No. 1118

DIGEST OF HB 1118 (Updated January 14, 2025 3:01 pm - DI 116)

Citations Affected: IC 36-8.

**Synopsis:** Critical incident stress management debriefings. Provides that a first responder recipient of critical incident stress management (CISM) services may not be compelled to testify or otherwise disclose a communication made to a CISM services provider or peer support team member relating to the first responder recipient's CISM services in a civil, criminal, or administrative proceeding. Provides that a first responder recipient or the first responder recipient's employer may not be held liable for damages for any act, error, or omission committed by the first responder recipient and CISM services provider, or peer support team as part of the CISM services unless the act, error, or omission constitutes wanton, willful, or intentional misconduct.

Effective: July 1, 2025.

## HOUSE BILL No. 1118

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning public safety.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 36-8-2.5-2, AS AMENDED BY P.L.7-2021,
2	SECTION 3, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3	JULY 1, 2025]: Sec. 2. (a) Except as otherwise provided in this section,
4	a communication made by a first responder recipient to:
5	(1) a CISM services provider while the first responder recipient
6	receives CISM services; or
7	(2) a peer support team member while the first responder
8	recipient receives peer support services;
9	is confidential. A first responder recipient may not be compelled to
10	testify or otherwise disclose a communication made to a CISM
11	services provider or peer support team member relating to the first
12	responder recipient's CISM services in a civil, criminal, or
13	administrative proceeding.
14	(b) A CISM services provider or peer support team member may not
15	be compelled to testify or otherwise disclose the communication
16	communications relating to CISM services in a civil, criminal, or
17	administrative proceeding without the consent of the first responder
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1 recipient. 2 (b) (c) Except as otherwise provided in this section, a record of a 3 communication kept by: 4 (1) a CISM services provider relating to CISM services; or 5 (2) a peer support team member relating to peer support services; 6 provided to a first responder recipient is confidential and is not subject 7 to subpoena, discovery, or introduction into evidence in a civil, 8 criminal, or administrative proceeding. 9 (c) (d) A communication is confidential for purposes of IC 5-14-3. 10 (d) (e) A communication is not confidential and may be disclosed for the following purposes: 11 (1) The CISM services provider or peer support team member 12 13 may disclose the communication to make a referral for the first 14 responder recipient. (2) The CISM services provider or peer support team member 15 16 may disclose the communication to consult about the first 17 responder recipient with a CISM services provider, peer support 18 team member, or an appropriate professional associated with the 19 CISM team or peer support team. 20 (3) The CISM services provider or peer support team member may disclose the communication to the extent reasonably 21 22 necessary to prevent a first responder recipient from committing a crime or fraud that the CISM services provider or peer support 23 24 team member reasonably believes is likely to result in death, 25 substantial bodily harm, or substantial economic injury to another. 26 (e) (f) A communication is not confidential if: 27 (1) the communication conveys information that the first responder recipient poses or appears to pose an imminent threat 28 29 of harm to the first responder recipient, a CISM services provider, 30 a peer support team member, or another individual; 31 (2) the communication conveys information relating to child, 32 spousal, or elder abuse; 33 (3) the first responder recipient or the legal representative of the first responder recipient expressly agrees that the first responder 34 35 recipient's communication is not confidential; 36 (4) the CISM services provider or the peer support team member 37 was a witness or a party to the incident that led to the provision of 38 CISM services or peer support services; or 39 (5) the first responder recipient consents to the disclosure of the 40 communication. 41 SECTION 2. (a) A first responder recipient or the first 2 responder recipient's employer may not be held liable for damages 3 for any act, error, or omission committed by the first responder 4 recipient, including: 5 (1) personal injury; 6 (2) wrongful death; 7 (3) property damage; or 8 (4) other loss; 9 based on a communication provided between a first responder 10 recipient and the CISM team, CISM services provider, or peer support team as part of the CISM services for the first responder 11 12 recipient unless the act, error, or omission committed by the first 13 responder recipient or the first responder recipient's employer constitutes wanton, willful, or intentional misconduct. 14 15 (a) (b) Except as provided in subsection (c), (d), a CISM team or a CISM services provider providing CISM services is not liable for 16 17 damages for any act, error, or omission committed by the CISM team 18 or the CISM services provider in performing CISM services in 19 accordance with this chapter, including: 20 (1) personal injury; 21 (2) wrongful death; 22 (3) property damage; or 23 (4) other loss; 24 unless the act, error, or omission constitutes wanton, willful, or 25 intentional misconduct. 26 (b) (c) Except as provided in subsection (c), (d), a peer support 27 services team or a peer support services team member providing peer 28 support services is not liable for damages for any act, error, or omission 29 committed by the peer support team or the peer support team member 30 in performing peer support services in accordance with this chapter, 31 including: 32 (1) personal injury; 33 (2) wrongful death; 34 (3) property damage; or 35 (4) other loss; 36 unless the act, error, or omission constitutes wanton, willful, or 37 intentional misconduct. 38 (c) (d) This section does not apply to an action for medical
