DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: Noncode.

Synopsis: Study of civil forfeiture laws. Urges the legislative counsel to assign to a study committee the topic of civil forfeiture laws. Provides that the study committee issue a final report to the legislative counsel containing the study committee's findings and recommendations not later than November 1, 2017.

Effective: Upon passage.

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January 5, 2017, read first time and referred to Committee on Judiciary.

A BILL FOR AN ACT concerning civil procedure.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. [EFFECTIVE UPON PASSAGE] (a) As used in this
SECTION, "legislative council" refers to the legislative council
established by IC 2-5-1.1-1.
(b) The legislative council is urged to assign to the appropriate
interim study committee during the 2017 legislative interim the
topic of civil forfeiture laws.
(c) If the topic described in subsection (b) is assigned to an
interim study committee, the interim study committee shall issue
a final report to the legislative council containing the interim study
committee's findings and recommendations, including any
recommended legislation, in an electronic format under IC 5-14-6
not later than November 1, 2017.
(d) This SECTION expires December 31, 2017.
SECTION 2. An emergency is declared for this act.
