## HOUSE BILL No. 1165

DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

**Citations Affected:** IC 35-31.5-2; IC 35-46-10.

**Synopsis:** Flight restrictions on unmanned aerial vehicles. Provides that a person who knowingly or intentionally flies an unmanned aerial vehicle within 400 feet of a critical infrastructure facility commits a Class A misdemeanor. Defines "critical infrastructure facility".

Effective: July 1, 2017.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning criminal law and procedure.
