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## HOUSE BILL No. 1199

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DIGEST OF HB 1199 (Updated January 30, 2019 6:23 pm - DI 77)

**Citations Affected:** IC 25-23.6.

**Synopsis:** Mental health professionals. Makes changes to the contact hours required for licensure in marriage and family therapy services. Removes references in behavioral health and human services licensing law to certified health care professionals. Specifies that the statutes concerning behavioral health and human services professionals may not be construed to limit addiction counseling performed by certain students, interns, and trainees studying in certain institutions. Requires an individual who is licensed as an addiction counselor or a clinical addiction counselor to: (1) display a counselor license or a clear copy of a counselor license at each location where the addiction counselor or clinical addiction counselor regularly practices; and (2) include certain information on the individual's professional marketing material. Changes certain educational and clinical experience requirements for a licensed addiction counselor and a licensed clinical addiction counselor.

## HOUSE BILL No. 1199

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A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning professions and occupations.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:*

1 SECTION 1. IC 25-23.6-1-9.5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA  
2 CODE AS A **NEW** SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS  
3 [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2019]: **Sec. 9.5. "Relational" means services**  
4 **that a marriage and family therapist or marriage and family**

 27 supervision of a licensed marriage and family therapist who  
 28 has at least five (5) years of experience or a qualified  
 29 supervisor approved by the board.
- 30 (B) The applicant received one hundred (100) hours of  
 31 supervision from a licensed marriage and family therapist who  
 32 has at least five (5) years experience as a qualified supervisor.
- 33 The requirements under clauses (A) and (B) may be met by a  
 34 supervised practice experience that took place away from an  
 35 institution of higher education but that is certified by an official  
 36 of the eligible postsecondary educational institution as being  
 37 equivalent to a graduate level practicum or internship program at  
 38 an institution accredited by an accrediting agency approved by the  
 39 United States Department of Education Commission on  
 40 Recognition of Postsecondary Education, the Association of

Page 10, after line 21, begin a new paragraph and insert:

**"(d) Notwithstanding subsection (a)(1)(B), an individual is not required to have a graduate level course credit in foundations of addiction counseling before July 1, 2021, to be eligible for licensure as a clinical addiction counselor. This subsection expires July 1, 2021."**
