HOUSE BILL No. 1247

DIGEST OF HB 1247 (Updated February 1, 2016 5:42 pm - DI 87)

Citations Affected: IC 7.1-3; IC 7.1-4.

Synopsis: Alcoholic beverage issues. Provides that the department of natural resources (department) may apply for a three-way permit for a state park. Provides that the alcohol and tobacco commission shall issue a permit to the department for a state park without: (1) publication of notice or investigation before a local board; and (2) regard to quota provisions. Provides that an annual permit fee for a three-way permit for a state park is \$250.

Effective: July 1, 2016.

HOUSE BILL No. 1247

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning alcohol and tobacco.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1 SECTION 1. IC 7.1-3-17.8 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
2 AS A **NEW** CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3 JULY 1, 2016]:

4 **Chapter 17.8. State Park Liquor Permits**

5 **Sec. 1. The department of natural resources may apply for a**
6 **three-way permit for one (1) or more state parks. A three-way**
7 **permit for a state park may be a single permit, even though more**
8 **than one (1) area within the state park constitutes the licensed**
9 **premises of the permit.**

10 **Sec. 2. A permit issued under this chapter is not subject to:**

- 11 (1) IC 7.1-3-9-10;
12 (2) IC 7.1-3-21-1;
13 (3) 905 IAC 1-27-1; and
14 (4) 905 IAC 1-27-4.

15 **Sec. 3. Separate areas within a state park are not subject to**
16 **IC 7.1-5-5-7.**

17 **Sec. 4. Upon application, the commission shall issue a permit to**

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1 the department of natural resources for a state park without:

2 (1) publication of notice or investigation before a local board;
3 and

4 (2) regard to the quota provisions of IC 7.1-3-22.

5 Sec. 5. Except as provided in sections 2 and 3 of this chapter, an
6 entity that operates on state park property under a permit issued
7 by the commission to:

8 (1) the department of natural resources under this chapter; or

9 (2) the entity under this article;

10 shall operate within the park property in accordance with the
11 provisions of this title that regulate the sale and use of alcoholic
12 beverages, e-liquid (as defined in IC 7.1-7-2-10), and tobacco
13 products (as defined in (IC 7.1-6-1-3).

14 SECTION 2. IC 7.1-4-4.1-9, AS AMENDED BY P.L.224-2005,
15 SECTION 21, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
16 JULY 1, 2016]: Sec. 9. (a) This section applies to the following
17 biennial permits:

18 (1) Beer retailer's permit.

19 (2) Liquor retailer's permit.

20 (3) Wine retailer's permit.

21 (4) One-way permit.

22 (5) Two-way permit.

23 (6) Three-way permit.

24 (7) Airplane beer permit.

25 (8) Airplane liquor permit.

26 (9) Airplane wine permit.

27 (10) Boat beer permit.

28 (11) Boat liquor permit.

29 (12) Boat wine permit.

30 (13) Dining car beer permit.

31 (14) Dining car liquor permit.

32 (15) Dining car wine permit.

33 (16) Hotel seasonal permit.

34 (b) The commission shall charge a single fee for the issuance of any
35 combination of retailer's permits issued for the same location or
36 conveyance.

37 (c) **Except as provided in subsection (d)**, an annual permit fee in
38 the following amount is imposed on a retailer:

39 (1) Five hundred dollars (\$500), if the retailer serves only beer or
40 only wine.

41 (2) Seven hundred fifty dollars (\$750), if the retailer serves both
42 beer and wine but no liquor.



- 1 (3) One thousand dollars (\$1,000), if the retailer serves beer,
- 2 wine, and liquor.
- 3 **(d) An annual permit fee for a three-way permit issued to a state**
- 4 **park under IC 7.1-3-17.8-1 is two hundred fifty dollars (\$250).**

Page 1, line 5, delete "(a)".

Page 1, line 10, delete "(b)" and insert "**Sec. 2.**".

Page 1, line 10, delete "section" and insert "**chapter**".

Page 1, line 15, delete "(c)" and insert "**Sec. 3.**".

Page 1, line 17, delete "(d)" and insert "**Sec. 4.**".

Page 2, between lines 4 and 5, begin a new paragraph and insert:

"Sec. 5. Except as provided in sections 2 and 3 of this chapter, an entity that operates on state park property under a permit issued by the commission to:

(1) the department of natural resources under this chapter; or

(2) the entity under this article;

shall operate within the park property in accordance with the provisions of this title that regulate the sale and use of alcoholic beverages, e-liquid (as defined in IC 7.1-7-2-10), and tobacco products (as defined in (IC 7.1-6-1-3))."
