A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning criminal law and procedure.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. IC 10-13-3-1 IS AMENDED TO READ AS

2	FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2023]: Sec. 1. As used in this
3	chapter, "bias crime" means an offense in which the person who
4	commits the offense knowingly or intentionally:
5	(1) selected the person who was injured; or
6	(2) damaged or otherwise affected property;
7	by the offense because of the color, creed, disability, national origin,
8	race, religion, gender identity, or sexual orientation of the injured
9	person or of the owner or occupant of the affected property or because
10	the injured person or owner or occupant of the affected property was
11	associated with any other recognizable group or affiliation.
