DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 21-12.

Synopsis: Twenty-first century scholars program. Defines, for purposes of the twenty-first century scholars program, "qualified early college student". Provides that a qualified early college student may apply to the commission for higher education for a twenty-first century scholarship to pay for postsecondary tuition costs associated with up to 30 postsecondary credit hours for dual credit or concurrent enrollment courses. Makes technical corrections.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

28	(b) This section applies to an individual who graduates from high
29	school after December 31, 2011. Except as provided in section 6.1(c)
30	of this chapter, to be eligible for a scholarship under this section, a
31	student must initially attend an eligible institution described in
32	subsection (a)(4) not later than the fall semester (or its equivalent, as
33	determined by the commission) in the year immediately following the

(c) The commission may allow a student who is otherwise ineligible under subsection (a)(6) for an award during the next academic year to maintain eligibility for an award if the student submits a petition to the commission and the commission makes a determination that extenuating circumstances (as determined by the commission) prevented the student from meeting the requirements under subsection (a)(6).

SECTION 8. IC 21-12-6-8, AS AMENDED BY P.L.281-2013, SECTION 18, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2020]: Sec. 8. A scholarship may be renewed under this chapter for a total scholarship award that does not exceed the number of academic terms that constitutes four (4) undergraduate academic years excluding academic terms completed by a qualified early college student under section 6.1 of this chapter while the student is in high school. The total scholarship award shall be proportionally reduced by the amount received by a qualified early college student under section 6.1 of this chapter.
