ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL No. 1362

DIGEST OF HB 1362 (Updated March 10, 2015 10:56 am - DI 103)

Citations Affected: IC 9-18; noncode.

Synopsis: License plate life cycle. Provides that the cycle for issuance and replacement of certain license plates is not less than five years and not more than 10 years. (Current law requires a five year cycle for the license plates.) Makes a technical correction.

Effective: July 1, 2015.

ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL No. 1362

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning motor vehicles.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

- 1 SECTION 1. IC 9-18-2-47, AS AMENDED BY P.L.212-2014,
2 SECTION 13, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3 JULY 1, 2015]: Sec. 47. (a) The ~~commissioner~~ **bureau** shall adopt
4 rules under IC 4-22-2 prescribing the cycle for the issuance and
5 replacement of license plates under this article. The rules adopted
6 under this section shall provide that a license plate for a vehicle issued
7 under this article is valid for:
8 **(1) not less than five (5) years; and**
9 **(2) not more than ten (10) years.**
10 (b) The rules adopted under this section do not apply to:
11 (1) truck license plates issued under section 4.5 (before its
12 expiration), 4.6, or 18 of this chapter; and
13 (2) general assembly and other state official license plates issued
14 under IC 9-18-16.
15 SECTION 2. [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2015] **(a) Before July 1, 2016,**

1 **the bureau of motor vehicles shall amend 140 IAC 2-1-14 to reflect**
2 **the license plate cycle of not less than five (5) years and not more**
3 **than ten (10) years as set forth in IC 9-18-2-47(a), as amended by**
4 **this act.**

5 **(b) This SECTION expires December 31, 2016.**
