HOUSE BILL No. 1362

DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 25-0.5-4-34; IC 25-17.6.

Synopsis: Geologist licensing. Adds and amends definitions concerning the licensure and practice of geologists. Allows the board of licensure for professional geologists (board) to elect a secretary who is not a member of the board. Requires the board to meet at least two times each year. Allows a licensed geologist to request an informal review within 30 days of receiving a complaint. (Current law allows the request to be made within 20 days.) Provides that if the board compels a licensed geologist to respond to a complaint or charges the response must be in writing and the notification must be sent by certified mail. Makes changes to the education and experience requirements to be a licensed geologist. Allows a person who is licensed in another state to be licensed in Indiana if the other state's standards are substantially equal to Indiana's requirements. (Current law allows a person who is certified in another state to apply for a state license and requires the other state's standards to be at least equal to Indiana's standards.) Requires a licensed professional geologist to obtain continuing education in the geological sciences as a condition of license renewal.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning professions and occupations.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

8	(c) Failure by a licensed professional geologist to request an

10	complaint constitutes an agreement to the terms of the proposed

12	SECTION 10. IC 25-17.6-3-7 IS AMENDED TO READ AS	
13	FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2017]: Sec. 7. (a) The board shall	
14	consider:	
15	(1) a request for review under section 5; or	
16	(2) charges under section 6;	
17	of this chapter during a meeting.	
18	(b) The board may compel a licensed professional geologist to	
19	respond to any matters in writing about a proposed complaint or	
20	charges. The board's notice to respond to a proposed complaint or	
21	charge must be sent to the licensed professional geologist by	
22	certified mail to the geologist's most recent address on file with the	
23	board.	
24	(c) The board may by rule establish procedures for the conduct of	
25	its review under this section, including the subpoena of witnesses and	
26	documents.	
27	(d) A review under this section shall be conducted in an informal	
28	manner. However, the board shall keep a record of the proceeding.	
29	(e) As soon as possible following the meeting, the board shall render	
30	a determination and either:	
31	(1) terminate its review; or	
32	(2) issue a determination under IC 4-21.5-3-6 to condition,	
33	suspend, or revoke the license of the licensed professional	
34	geologist.

8	(A) Five (5) years of teaching geology as a faculty member at

11	college or university level at an accredited college or

13	(C) Five (5) years of geological work performed under the
14	supervision of, or in collaboration with, a licensed professional
15	geologist.
16	(D) Seven (7) years of geological work that is acceptable to the
17	board.
18	(3) A passing score on an examination required by the board that
19	has been designed to demonstrate that the applicant has the
20	necessary knowledge and skill to exercise the responsibilities of
21	the public practice of geology.
22	SECTION 12. IC 25-17.6-4-2 IS AMENDED TO READ AS
23	FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2017]: Sec. 2. In counting years of
24	experience under section 1(2) of this chapter, the board may give one
25	(1) year of credit each for a master's degree or doctoral degree in
26	geology, geophysics, geochemistry, geological engineering, or
27	geotechnical engineering. geological sciences.
28	SECTION 13. IC 25-17.6-4-5 IS AMENDED TO READ AS
29	FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2017]: Sec. 5. Upon application,
30	licensure may be provided to a person who is licensed or certified as a
31	geologist in a state that has standards for licensure or certification at
32	least substantially equal to those for licensure under this chapter, as
33	determined by the board.
34	SECTION 14. IC 25-17.6-5-5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA
35	CODE AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS
36	[EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2017]: Sec. 5. (a) The board shall adopt rules
37	in accordance with IC 25-1-4 to require a licensed professional
38	geologist to obtain continuing education in the geological sciences
39	as a condition of license renewal.
40	(b) The continuing education requirements adopted under this
41	section must allow a licensed professional geologist to receive full

credit for continuing education courses taken in a state other than



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Indiana.

(c) The continuing education requirements adopted under this
section do not apply to a licensed professional geologist until after
the first full license renewal cycle beginning after July 2018.
