## **HOUSE BILL No. 1427**

## DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 25-0.5; IC 25-22.7.

**Synopsis:** Licensure of naturopathic physicians. Provides for the licensure of practitioners of naturopathic medicine. Specifies certain individuals who are not required to be licensed. Establishes the board of naturopathic medicine (board). Establishes license requirements. Requires licensed naturopathic doctors to obtain continuing education for license renewal. Requires a licensed naturopathic doctor, licensed health care provider, health care facility, state agency, and state or local law enforcement agency to file a complaint with the board if the person, based on personal knowledge or information, reasonably believes that a naturopathic doctor is or may be violating certain standards of practice. Provides that an individual who is not licensed may not use certain descriptions, titles, or initials to indicate or imply that the individual is a licensed naturopathic doctor.

Effective: July 1, 2018.

22	Sec. 6. The board may waive any examination requirement for

7	license to practice naturopathic medicine who meets the
8	requirements of this chapter.
9	Sec. 10. A licensed naturopathic doctor may do the following:
10	(1) Order and perform physical and laboratory examinations
11	for diagnostic purposes, including:
12	(A) phlebotomy;
13	(B) clinical laboratory tests;
14	(C) orificial examinations;
15	(D) electrocardiograms; and
16	(E) physiological function tests.
17	(2) Order diagnostic imaging studies.
18	(3) Interpret the reports of diagnostic imaging studies.
19	(4) Dispense, order, or administer natural medicines of
20	mineral, animal, or botanical origin, including:
21	(A) food and extracts of food;
22	(B) nutraceuticals;
23	(C) vitamins;
24	(D) amino acids;
25	(E) minerals;
26	(F) enzymes;
27	(G) botanicals, including botanical extracts;
28	(H) botanical medicines;
29	(I) homeopathic medicines; and
30	(J) all dietary supplements and nonprescription drugs as
31	defined by the federal Food, Drug and Cosmetic Act (21
32	U.S.C. 301 et seq.) using routes of administration,
33	including:
34	(i) oral;
35	(ii) nasal;
36	(iii) auricular;
37	(iv) ocular;
38	(v) rectal;
39	(vi) vaginal;
40	(vii) transdermal; and
41	(viii) intramuscular.
12	(5) Administer or perform.



1	(A) hot or cold hydrotherapy;
2	(B) naturopathic physical medicine;
3	(C) electromagnetic energy;
4	(D) colon hydrotherapy; and
5	(E) therapeutic exercise for the purpose of providing basic

	over-the-counter pharmaceuticals.
26	(3) Perform minor office procedures if the licensed
27	naturopathic doctor is authorized by the board to do so,
28	including the use of anesthetics or antiseptics in connection
29	with minor surgery.
30	(4) Use routes of administration, including intradermal,
31	subcutaneous, and intravenous.
32	Sec. 12. Except as provided in section 13 of this chapter, a
33	licensed naturopathic doctor may not do any of the following:
34	(1) Prescribe or administer any controlled substance or device
35	identified in the federal Controlled Substances Act (21 U.S.C.
36	801 et seq.), except as authorized by the board.
37	(2) Perform surgical procedures other than minor office
38	procedures, including procedures using a laser device or that
39	involve the eyes, ears, tendons, nerves, veins, or arteries
40	extending beyond superficial tissues.
41	(3) Practice or claim to practice as any health care provider
42	that is regulated under this title unless the licensed



1	naturopathic doctor is licensed, certified, registered, or
2	regulated by an entity described in IC 25-0.5-11 that governs
3	that type of health care provider.
4	(4) Use general or spinal anesthetics.
5	(5) Administer ionizing radioactive substances for therapeutic
6	purposes.
7	(6) Perform acupuncture, unless the licensed naturopathic
8	doctor is approved by the board to perform acupuncture or
9	is a licensed acupuncturist.
10	(7) Perform minor office procedures, unless the licensed
l 1	naturopathic doctor is approved by the board to perform the
12	procedures and the requirements under section 13 of this
13	chapter are met.
14	(8) Prescribe prescription drugs, unless the licensed
15	naturopathic doctor is approved by the board to prescribe
16	prescription drugs.
17	Sec. 13. The board may approve a licensed naturopathic doctor
18	to perform minor office procedures only if the licensec
19	naturopathic doctor:
20	(1) graduated from an approved naturopathic medica
21	program that included minor office procedures as part of its
22	curriculum; or
23	(2) meets the training requirements regarding minor office
24	procedures adopted by the board.
25	Sec. 14. The board may approve a licensed naturopathic doctor

after learning the information.
Sec. 5. A health care facility shall report promptly to the board
if:
(1) a licensed naturopathic doctor voluntarily resigns from the
staff of the health care facility;
(2) a licensed naturopathic doctor voluntarily limits the
licensed naturopathic doctor's staff privileges; or
(3) a licensed naturopathic doctor fails to reapply for hospita
privileges at the health care facility;
while the licensed naturopathic doctor is under formal or informa
investigation by the health care facility for possible medica
incompetence, unprofessional conduct, or mental or physica
impairment.
Sec. 6. Subject to IC 25-1-7, the board shall investigate a
complaint that alleges a violation under this article.
Chapter 6. General Provisions
Sec. 1. A licensed naturopathic doctor may receive a fee for
professional consultation services.
Sec. 2. A licensed naturopathic doctor engaged in the private
practice of naturopathic medicine shall conspicuously display the
naturopathic doctor's license in each office where the naturopathic
doctor practices.
Chapter 7. Unlawful Practice and Discipline
Sec. 1. Except as otherwise provided in this article, only a
licensed naturopathic doctor may practice naturopathic medicine
Sec. 2. Unless the individual is licensed under this article, ar
individual may not:
(1) represent to the public by title, description of services
methods, procedures, or otherwise that the individual is
licensed to practice naturopathic medicine;
(2) use the title "doctor of naturopathic medicine", "doctor o
naturopathy", "naturopathic doctor", "doctor of
naturopathic medicine", or "naturopath"; or
(3) use the initials "N.D.", "ND", "N.M.D.", or "NMD" after
the name of the individual;
to indicate or imply that the individual is licensed under this
article.
