HOUSE BILL No. 1490

DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 27-1-2.1.

Synopsis: Health care sharing ministries. Requires a health care sharing ministry to hold a current certificate of registration, issued by the department of insurance, to conduct business in Indiana. Establishes a registration and renewal process for health care sharing ministries.

Effective: July 1, 2021.

HOUSE BILL No. 1490

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning insurance.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 27-1-2.1-1, AS ADDED BY P.L.13-2012,
2	SECTION 1, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3	JULY 1, 2021]: Sec. 1. (a) As used in this chapter, "health care sharing
4	ministry" means a nonprofit organization that:
5	(1) is comprised only of participants who share similar and
6	sincerely held religious beliefs;
7	(2) is tax exempt under Section $501(c)(3)$ of the Internal Revenue
8	Code;
9	(3) acts as a facilitator among participants who have financial or
10	medical needs that are qualified in accordance with the
11	organization's criteria, matching those participants with other
12	participants who have the present ability to assist with financial
13	or medical needs;
14	(4) provides for the financial or medical needs of a participant
15	through contributions from one (1) participant to another
16	participant;
17	(5) provides information about amounts that participants, with no



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1	assumption of risk or promise to pay, may contribute for
2	distribution:
3	(A) among the participants; or
4	(B) by the organization to participants; and
5	(6) provides a written monthly statement to all participants that
6	specifies:
7	(A) the total dollar amount of qualified needs submitted to the
8	organization; and
9	(B) the amount actually published or assigned to participants
10	for their contribution. and
11	(7) includes the following statement, in writing, on or
12	accompanying all applications and guideline materials:
13	"Notice: The organization facilitating the sharing of medical
14	expenses is not an insurance company, and neither its
15	guidelines nor its plan of operation is an insurance policy. Any
16	assistance you receive with your medical bills will be totally
17	voluntary. Neither the organization nor any other participant
18 19	ean be compelled by law to contribute toward your medical
19 20	bills. As such, participation in the organization or a
20 21	subscription to any of its documents should never be considered to be insurance. Whether or not you receive any
$\frac{21}{22}$	payments for medical expenses and whether or not this
$\frac{22}{23}$	organization continues to operate, you are always personally
24	responsible for the payment of your own medical bills.".
25	(b) The term does not include a fraternal benefit society described
26	in IC 27-11-1-1.
27	SECTION 2. IC 27-1-2.1-3 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
28	AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
29	1, 2021]: Sec. 3. A health care sharing ministry must provide a
30	written disclaimer on or accompanying all application forms,
31	marketing materials, and guideline materials distributed by or on
32	behalf of the health care sharing ministry that states the following:
33	"NOTICE: The organization facilitating the sharing of
34	medical expenses is not an insurance company, and neither its
35	guidelines nor plan of operation constitute an insurance
36	policy. Without health care insurance, there is no guarantee
37 38	that you, a fellow participant, or any other person who was a next, to the health save ministry agreement will be protected
38 39	party to the health care ministry agreement will be protected in the event of illness or emergency. Regardless of whether
39 40	you receive any payment for medical expenses or whether this
40 41	organization terminates, withdraws from the faith based
42	agreement, or continues to operate, you are always personally
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1	responsible for the payment of your own medical bills. If your
2 3	participation in such an organization ends, state law may
	subject you to a waiting period before providing coverage.".
4	SECTION 3. IC 27-1-2.1-4 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
5	AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
6	1, 2021]: Sec. 4. (a) A health care sharing ministry must hold a
7	current certificate of registration issued by the department to
8	operate in Indiana. To obtain a certificate of registration, a health
9	care sharing ministry must submit the following to the department:
10	(1) An application for registration on a form promulgated by
11	the insurance commissioner, which must include the
12	following:
13	(A) The name of the responsible director or manager of the
14	health care sharing ministry's plans.
15	(B) The contact address for the health care sharing
16	ministry.
17	(C) The contact phone number for the responsible director
18	or manager.
19	(2) A copy of the certification letter issued to the health care
20	sharing ministry by the federal Centers for Medicare and
21	Medicaid Services.
22	(3) A copy of the health care sharing ministry's current
23	annual audit required under 26 U.S.C. 5000A(d)(2)(B).
24	(4) A list of any third party vendors acting on behalf of the
25	health care sharing ministry for purposes of enrolling
26	members, negotiating with medical providers, or financial
27	sharing of members' medical needs.
28	(5) Copies of any application forms or ministry guidelines
29	used by the health care sharing ministry.
30	(6) A report on the health care sharing ministry's members
31	who are residents of Indiana as of the date of the application
32	for registration, which must include the following:
33	(A) The total number of enrolled members who are
34	residents of Indiana.
35	(B) A distribution of the enrolled members who are
36	residents of Indiana by age.
37	(C) A distribution of the enrolled members who are
38	residents of Indiana by sex.
39	(7) An application fee of one hundred dollars (\$100).
40	(b) The department must issue a certificate of registration to a
41	health care sharing ministry that submits an application for
42	registration that meets the requirements of subsection (a).



1	SECTION 4. IC 27-1-2.1-5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
2	AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
3	1, 2021]: Sec. 5. (a) A certificate of registration obtained under
4	section 4 of this chapter must be renewed on or before January 1
5	of each year by submitting the following to the department:
6	(1) An application for renewal on a form promulgated by the
7	insurance commissioner.
8	(2) A copy of the health care sharing ministry's current
9	annual audit required under 26 U.S.C. 5000A(d)(2)(B).
10	(3) An updated list of any third party vendors acting on behalf
11	of the health care sharing ministry for purposes of enrolling
12	members, negotiating with medical providers, or financial
13	sharing of members' medical needs.
14	(4) Any current application forms or ministry guidelines that
15	are not presently on file with the department.
16	(5) A report on the health care sharing ministry's members
17	who are residents of Indiana as of the date of the application
18	for renewal, which must include the following:
19	(A) The total number of enrolled members who are
20	residents of Indiana.
21	(B) A distribution of the enrolled members who are
22	residents of Indiana by age.
23	(C) A distribution of the enrolled members who are
24	residents of Indiana by sex.
25	(6) A renewal fee of one hundred dollars (\$100).
26	(b) The department must renew the certificate of registration of
27	a health care sharing ministry that submits an application for
28	renewal that meets the requirements of subsection (a).
29	(c) A certificate of registration issued or renewed under this
30	chapter expires at midnight on December 31 of each year. The
31	insurance commissioner must send notice of the impending
32	expiration of a current certificate of registration not later than
33 34	thirty (30) days before the expiration of the current certificate of
34 35	registration.
33 36	(d) The insurance commissioner may renew a certificate of registration which was inadvertently allowed to expire if the health
30 37	care sharing ministry makes a request not later than ninety (90)
38	days after the date of the certificate's expiration. To be granted a
39	renewal under this subsection, the health care sharing ministry
40	must pay a civil penalty to the department as follows:
41	(1) For a renewal requested one (1) to thirty (30) days after a
42	certificate's expiration, two hundred fifty dollars (\$250).

5	(e) If a health care sharing ministry fails to obtain a renewal of
6 7	its certificate of registration under subsection (b) or (d), the health
8	care sharing ministry is prohibited from: (1) reapplying for a certificate of registration for two (2)
8 9	years; and
10	(2) operating in Indiana until it obtains a new certificate of
11	registration.
12	SECTION 5. IC 27-1-2.1-6 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
13	AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
14	1,2021]: Sec. 6. The department shall post all information provided
15	by health care sharing ministries under sections 4 and 5 of this
16	chapter that is not considered proprietary or confidential on the
17	department's Internet web site. The information must be
18	prominently displayed and include an explanation of the
19	differences between health care sharing ministries and health
20	insurance.
21	SECTION 6. IC 27-1-2.1-7 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
22	AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
23	1, 2021]: Sec. 7. A health care sharing ministry may not operate
24	under any name other than the name for which a certificate of
25	registration is issued or renewed under this chapter.
26	SECTION 7. IC 27-1-2.1-8 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
27	AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
28	1, 2021]: Sec. 8. (a) A health care sharing ministry registered in
29	Indiana is subject to the anti-fraud provisions of the department.
30	(b) A purported health care sharing ministry operating in
31	Indiana without a current certificate of registration is subject to
32	the full authority of the department under IC 27-4-5 and the
33	attorney general under IC 23-17-24.
34	SECTION 8. IC 27-1-2.1-9 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
35	AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
36	1, 2021]: Sec. 9. The department may adopt rules under IC 4-22-2
37	necessary to implement this chapter.
