# HOUSE BILL No. 1555

### DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

### Citations Affected: IC 25-22.5-5-7.

**Synopsis:** Licensure of foreign trained physicians. Establishes a limited medical license for individuals who: (1) have graduated from certain international medical programs; (2) obtain a health care facility sponsor in an underserved area; and (3) meet certain other criteria. Provides that a limited medical license authorizes the recipient to practice medicine or osteopathic medicine only at a health care facility in an underserved area. Enables the medical license if the recipient stops working as a physician at a health care facility in an underserved area. Provides that a limited medical license may be converted to an unlimited license at the discretion of the board after five years.

Effective: July 1, 2025.

# **HOUSE BILL No. 1555**

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning professions and occupations.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 25-22.5-5-7 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
2	AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
3	1, 2025]: Sec. 7. (a) For purposes of this section, "health care
4	facility" has the meaning set forth in IC 16-21-11-1.
5	(b) For purposes of this section, "underserved area" means a
6	county, city, town, census tract, or township designated by the
7	Indiana department of health under IC 16-46-5-7 as underserved
8	by physicians.
9	(c) Except as provided in subsection (d), the board may issue a
10	limited license to an individual if the following apply:
11	(1) The individual applies in a form and manner required by
12	the board.
13	(2) The individual pays a fee set by the board.
14	(3) The individual:
15	(A) holds:
16	(i) a medical doctorate or substantially similar degree
17	issued by an international medical program in good

1	standing; and
2	(ii) a certificate issued by the Educational Commission
3	on Foreign Medical Graduates;
4	(B) is in good standing with the medical licensing or
5	regulatory institution of the individual's resident country
6	and has no pending discipline before the licensing or
7	regulatory institution;
8	(C) completed a residency program or other similar
9	postgraduate medical training that is substantially similar
10	to a residency program accredited by the Accreditation
11	Council for Graduate Medical Education;
12	(D) practiced medicine or osteopathic medicine as a
13	licensed physician for five (5) years following the
14	completion of the residency program or other similar
15	postgraduate medical training described in clause (C);
16	(E) achieved a passing score on both step one (1) and step
17	two (2) of the United States Medical Licensing
18	Examination; and
19	(F) is proficient in the English language.
20	(4) The individual has an offer of employment as a physician
21	at a health care facility in an underserved area.
22	(d) The board may not issue a limited license under this section
23	to an individual who does not possess a federal immigration status
24	allowing the individual to practice as a physician in the United
25	States.
26	(e) A limited license under this section:
27	(1) authorizes the recipient to practice medicine or
28	osteopathic medicine only at a health care facility in an
29	underserved area; and
30	(2) is valid for a period of six (6) years.
31	(f) The board may revoke a limited license under this section if:
32	(1) the recipient is no longer employed as a physician at a
33	health care facility in an undeserved area; or
34	(2) there is compelling reason to revoke the limited license.
35	(g) Notwithstanding IC 25-22.5-3, a limited license under this
36	section may be converted to an unlimited license at the discretion
37	of the board after five (5) years.
