

HOUSE RESOLUTION No.

Introduced by: Manning

A HOUSE RESOLUTION urging the United States Congress to take such actions as are necessary to enact a policy that supports United States businesses and workers while penalizing global polluters.

Whereas, Chinese government-owned industry is an arm of the Communist Party and strives to increase its influence over the global economy by pursuing predatory, unfair trade practices designed to steal intellectual property and destroy competition from the United States;

Whereas, China's dominance of key components of the global supply chain, including those related to critical minerals, represents a threat to the United States' economic security and economic and social development;

Whereas, China, by far the world's biggest polluter, accounts

for over 30% of global carbon dioxide pollution and subsidizes 1 its exports by not imposing or enforcing reasonable 2 environmental and labor standards; 3 Whereas, The United States has eliminated more carbon 4 pollution than any other country in the last 15 years, and its 5 economy is 44% more carbon-efficient than the world average; 6 7 Whereas, United States manufacturers are more efficient in 8 nearly every industry, from steel to pharmaceuticals to automobiles, and yet are forced to compete with companies in 9 10 China and elsewhere that face few limits on how much they 11 pollute: Whereas, Goods produced in China, on average, generate 12 three times the carbon pollution of equivalent goods made in 13 14 the United States, and goods produced in Russia emit four times the pollution; 15 Whereas, Many rural Americans are being left behind 16 17 economically, suffering from severe poverty, poor health care, and few economic opportunities, making them increasingly 18 vulnerable to crime and the opioid crisis; 19 Whereas, Manufacturing jobs play a more important role in 20 the rural economy than in urban areas, accounting for a 21 greater share of economic development; 22 Whereas, United States trade policy, which has given foreign 23 polluters an unfair advantage over the past two decades, has 24 encouraged economic restructuring across rural America that 25 has resulted in manufacturing employment falling by nearly 26 30%; 27 28 Whereas, China has been the major beneficiary of this poorly designed federal trade policy at the expense of U.S. 29 industry; 30 Whereas, Rewarding U.S. firms for their environmental 31 performance would bolster domestic manufacturing, generate 32 well-paying jobs, and reduce dependence on imports from 33 high-emitting producers like Russia and China; and 34

Whereas, Proposed Environmental Protection Agency
regulations would do the opposite and undermine America's
steel industry, hurt steel manufacturers and steelworkers, and
ship steel jobs overseas: Therefore,

Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. That the Indiana House of Representatives urges the United States Congress to take such actions as are necessary to enact a policy that holds high-polluting countries like China and Russia accountable for their pollution and promotes American economic development and the rebuilding of United States supply chains, particularly in rural communities, by rewarding American businesses and workers for their superior environmental performance while penalizing global polluters.

SECTION 2. That the Principal Clerk of the House of Representatives transmit a copy of this resolution to the presiding officers of the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Congress of the United States and to each member of the Indiana Congressional delegation.
