A HOUSE RESOLUTION designating Hypertrophic
 Cardiomyopathy Awareness Day and efforts to educate people
 about hypertrophic cardiomyopathy.

Whereas, hypertrophic cardiomyopathy (HCM) is a chronic
cardiovascular disease involving thickening of the heart muscle
that can potentially lead to debilitating symptoms and serious
complications, including heart failure, atrial fibrillation,
stroke, and in rare cases, sudden cardiac death;

Whereas, HCM is the most common inheritable heart disease
and can affect anyone regardless of age, gender, or ethnicity,
with a reported prevalence ranging from 1 in 200 to 1 in 500 in
the general population;

Whereas, An estimated 700,000 to 1,650,000 people in the
United States have HCM, yet 85% of them may remain

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1 *undiagnosed;*

Whereas, HCM shares symptoms with other common 2 cardiovascular and pulmonary diseases, such as shortness of 3 breath, chest pain, fatigue, palpitations, and fainting, making 4 it difficult to distinguish HCM from these other diseases; 5 Whereas, All-cause mortality risk is three to four times 6 higher in patients with HCM than that of the general 7 8 population; 9 Whereas, Knowing one's medical history and any signs and symptoms of HCM is an important first step in receiving an 10 accurate diagnosis of HCM; 11 Whereas, A physician must conduct a thorough screening 12 13 with cardiac health questions to help identify a risk of cardiac disorders both genetic and congenital; 14 Whereas, A physician may conduct several tests, including 15 an echocardiogram, a cardiac MRI, or genetic testing to 16 confirm a family history of HCM, and must examine the heart 17 to diagnose HCM; 18 19 Whereas, Following a diagnosis of HCM, it is important for patients to work with their physician to learn more about their 20 disease and understand different management options, 21 including prescription medicines and surgical treatment 22 options that may help; and 23 Whereas, The fourth Wednesday in February is an 24 appropriate day to observe Hypertrophic Cardiomyopathy 25 Awareness Day: Therefore, 26 27 *Be it resolved by the House of Representatives of the* General Assembly of the State of Indiana: 28 SECTION 1. That the Indiana House of Representatives 29 designates the fourth Wednesday in February of each year as 30 "Hypertrophic Cardiomyopathy Awareness Day" in the state of 31 Indiana in order to raise public awareness about hypertrophic 32 cardiomyopathy as a serious public health issue. 33



1 SECTION 2. That the Indiana House of Representatives 2 acknowledges the critical importance of hypertrophic 3 cardiomyopathy awareness to improve cardiovascular health in 4 the state of Indiana.

5 SECTION 3. That the Indiana House of Representatives 6 supports raising awareness of the consequences of undiagnosed 7 and untreated hypertrophic cardiomyopathy and the need to 8 seek appropriate care for hypertrophic cardiomyopathy.

9 SECTION 4. That the Indiana House of Representatives 10 respectfully requests the Governor to issue annually a 11 proclamation recognizing the fourth Wednesday in February in 12 Indiana as "Hypertrophic Cardiomyopathy Awareness Day" and 13 calls upon the people in the state of Indiana to observe the day 14 with appropriate programs and activities.

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
