DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 34-30-32.

Synopsis: Civil immunity related to COVID-19. Provides civil immunity for damages resulting from exposure of an individual to COVID-19 on the premises owned or operated by a person, on any premises on which the person or an employee or agent of the person provided property or services to the individual, or during an activity managed, organized, or sponsored by the person.

Effective: March 1, 2020 (retroactive).

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning civil procedure.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1 SECTION 1. IC 34-30-32 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
2 AS A **NEW** CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3 MARCH 1, 2020 (RETROACTIVE)]:
4 **Chapter 32. Immunity Related to COVID-19**
5 **Sec. 1. As used in this chapter, "COVID-19" means:**
6 (1) **severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus 2; or**
7 (2) **the disease caused by severe acute respiratory syndrome**
8 **coronavirus 2.**
9 **Sec. 2. As used in this chapter, "person" means:**
10 (1) **an individual;**
11 (2) **an association;**
12 (3) **an institution;**
13 (4) **a corporation;**
14 (5) **a company;**
15 (6) **a trust;**
16 (7) **a limited liability company;**
17 (8) **a partnership;**



- 1 **(9) a political subdivision;**
 2 **(10) a government office, department, division, bureau, or**
 3 **other body of government; or**
 4 **(11) any other organization or entity.**
 5 **Sec. 3. As used in this chapter, "premises" means real property**
 6 **and any appurtenant building or structure.**
 7 **Sec. 4. Subject to the other provisions of this chapter, a person**
 8 **is immune from civil liability for damages resulting from exposure**
 9 **of an individual to COVID-19:**
 10 **(1) on the premises owned or operated by the person;**
 11 **(2) on any premises on which the person or an employee or**
 12 **agent of the person provided property or services to the**
 13 **individual; or**
 14 **(3) during an activity managed, organized, or sponsored by**
 15 **the person.**
 16 **Sec. 5. This chapter does not grant immunity from civil liability**
 17 **to a person whose actions or omissions constitute gross negligence**
 18 **or willful or wanton misconduct as proven by clear and convincing**
 19 **evidence.**
 20 **Sec. 6. (a) This chapter supplements and is in addition to:**
 21 **(1) IC 34-13-3 (Indiana Tort Claims Act); and**
 22 **(2) IC 34-18 (Indiana Medical Malpractice Act).**
 23 **(b) This chapter does not apply to:**
 24 **(1) IC 22-3-2 (Worker's Compensation);**
 25 **(2) IC 22-3-7 (Worker's Occupational Diseases**
 26 **Compensation); or**
 27 **(3) IC 22-8 (Occupational Health and Safety).**
 28 **Sec. 7. The immunity provided in this chapter is in addition to**
 29 **any other immunity protection that may apply under state or**
 30 **federal law.**
 31 **Sec. 8. This chapter expires December 31, 2024.**
 32 **SECTION 2. An emergency is declared for this act.**
