DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 36-8-11-14.

Synopsis: Fire protection district per diems. Increases, from \$20 to \$100, the maximum per diem of a member of the board of fire trustees of a fire protection district.

Effective: July 1, 2017.

SENATE BILL No. 5

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning local government.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1 SECTION 1. IC 36-8-11-14 IS AMENDED TO READ AS
2 FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2017]: Sec. 14. (a) At the first
3 regular meeting each year, the trustees of the board shall elect a
4 chairman and vice chairman from their number. The vice chairman
5 shall act as chairman during the absence or disability of the chairman.
6 (b) A majority of the trustees constitutes a quorum. An action of the
7 board is official, however, only if it is authorized by a majority of the
8 trustees at a regular or properly called special meeting.
9 (c) Each trustee may receive not more than **twenty one hundred**
10 dollars ~~(\$20)~~ **(\$100)** a day for each day devoted to the work of the
11 district. In addition, each trustee may be reimbursed for actual
12 expenses, including traveling expense at a rate equivalent to that
13 provided by statute for state employees. Claims for expense
14 reimbursement must be accompanied by an itemized written statement
15 and approved by a recorded motion of the board.
16 (d) At the time the county legislative body initially appoints the
17 board, it shall order where the board will maintain its offices. The



1 offices may not be changed without approval of the legislative body.
2 The board shall arrange for office space and keep a record of all
3 transactions and minutes of all meetings in the office. All records and
4 minutes shall be kept available for public inspection.
