DIGEST OF SB 10 (Updated January 17, 2018 1:58 pm - DI 84)

Citations Affected: IC 3-5.

Synopsis: Town employees holding elected office. Provides that the requirements for certain government employees to hold office do not apply to a town having a population of less than 2,500.

Effective: July 1, 2018.

SENATE BILL No. 10

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning elections.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1 SECTION 1. IC 3-5-9-0.5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
2 AS A **NEW** SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
3 1, 2018]: **Sec. 0.5. This chapter does not apply to a town having a**
4 **population of less than two thousand five hundred (2,500).**
