DIGEST OF SB 21 (Updated January 8, 2014 12:26 pm - DI 84)

Citations Affected: IC 33-33.

Synopsis: Vanderburgh circuit court magistrate. Allows the judge of the Vanderburgh circuit court to appoint a second full-time magistrate. (The introduced version of this bill was prepared by the commission on courts.)

Effective: July 1, 2014.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:
