

SENATE BILL No. 38

DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 20-33-2-19.

Synopsis: Released time religious instruction. Provides that a public secondary school student may receive not more than two elective academic credits for released time religious instruction classes if the governing body of the school corporation adopts a policy that allows the awarding of credit, and certain conditions are met.

Effective: July 1, 2016.

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A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1 SECTION 1. IC 20-33-2-19, AS ADDED BY P.L.1-2005,
2 SECTION 17, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3 JULY 1, 2016]: Sec. 19. (a) When the parent of a student who is
4 enrolled in a public school makes a written request, the principal may
5 allow the student to attend a school for religious instruction that is
6 conducted by a church, an association of churches, or an association
7 that is organized for religious instruction and incorporated under
8 Indiana law.

9 (b) If a principal grants permission under subsection (a), the
10 principal shall specify a period or periods, not to exceed one hundred
11 twenty (120) minutes in total in any week, for the student to receive
12 religious instruction. The permission is valid only for the year in which
13 it is granted. Decisions made by a principal under this section may be
14 reviewed by the superintendent.

15 (c) A school for religious instruction that receives students under
16 this section:

17 (1) shall maintain attendance records and allow inspection of



1 these records by attendance officers; and

2 (2) may not be supported, in whole or in part, by public funds.

3 (d) A student who attends a school for religious instruction under
4 this section shall receive the same attendance credit that the student
5 would receive for attendance in the public schools for the same length
6 of time.

7 (e) **A public secondary school may award academic credit to a
8 student who attends religious instruction under this section if the
9 governing body of the school corporation adopts a policy that
10 allows the awarding of credit. A policy adopted under this
11 subsection must provide the following:**

12 **(1) Classes in religious instruction are evaluated on the basis
13 of purely secular criteria in substantially the same manner as
14 similar classes taken by a student at a nonpublic secondary
15 school who transfers to a public secondary school are
16 evaluated to determine whether the student receives transfer
17 credit for the classes. Secular criteria may include the
18 following in addition to other secular criteria established by
19 the governing body:**

20 **(A) The number of hours of classroom instructional time.**

21 **(B) A review of the course syllabus that reflects the course
22 requirements and materials.**

23 **(C) Methods of assessment used in the course.**

24 **(D) Whether the course is taught by a licensed teacher.**

25 **(2) The decision of whether to award academic credit is
26 neutral as to, and does not involve any test for, religious
27 content or denominational affiliation.**

28 **A student may be awarded a total of not more than two (2) elective
29 academic credits under this subsection.**
