A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning family law and juvenile law.

0	(2) not licensed as a foster parent under IC 31-27-4.
1	SECTION 2. IC 31-32-4-1 IS AMENDED TO READ AS
2	FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2024]: Sec. 1. The following
3	persons are entitled to be represented by counsel:
4	(1) A child charged with a delinquent act, as provided by
5	IC 31-32-2-2.
6	(2) A parent, in a proceeding to terminate the parent-child
7	relationship, as provided by IC 31-32-2-5.



1	(3) An unlicensed caregiver (as defined by IC 31-9-2-131.7) in
2	a proceeding for a child in need of services if the court
3	determines that the unlicensed caregiver is indigent as

5	(3) (4) Any other person designated by law.
