Synopsis: Teacher preparation time. Requires each governing body and its administrators to arrange each teacher's daily working schedule to provide 30 consecutive minutes as teacher preparation time that is free of any other assigned responsibilities.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

7	for a period free of duties.
8	(2) Thirty (30) consecutive minutes during the student
9	instructional day as a guaranteed preparation period that is
10	free of any other assigned responsibilities.
11	(b) The state superintendent shall report each failure to comply with
12	subsection (a) to the state board, which shall immediately inform the
13	governing body of each alleged violation.
14	(c) If the school corporation persistently fails or refuses to comply
15	with subsection (a) for one (1) year, the state board shall:
16	(1) lower the grade of accreditation of the school corporation; and
17	(2) publish notice of that action in at least one (1) newspaper
