## SENATE BILL No. 73

## DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 13-30-3-1.2.

**Synopsis:** Reports of potential violations to IDEM. Authorizes the department of environmental management (department) to facilitate the submission of reports of potential environmental violations by means of a printed form, a dedicated telephone number, and an online form available through the department's Internet web site. Provides: (1) that the printed report form must include a space in which the individual submitting the report is directed to write the individual's name and address; (2) that when a call is made to the dedicated telephone number, the caller must be asked to give the caller's name and address; and (3) that the online form must include fields in which the individual submitting the report is to enter the individual's name and address, and that the department's Internet web site must be programmed so as not to allow the submission of a report unless those fields are filled in. Provides that, upon the request of a person to whom a report of a potential violation refers, the department shall disclose the identity of the individual who made the report unless the individual's identity is excepted from disclosure under the public records law.

Effective: July 1, 2020.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning environmental law.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

4	(b) The department may facilitate the submission of reports

(2) Providing a dedicated telephone number for use in
submitting reports to the department by telephone.
(3) Establishing a means for the submission of reports to the
department through the department's Internet web site.
(c) A form made available under subsection (b)(1) must include
a space in which the individual submitting the report is directed to
write the individual's name and address.
(d) When a call is made to a dedicated telephone number
provided under subsection (b)(2), the officer or employee of the
department answering the call shall ask the caller to give the
caller's name and address.
(e) If an online form is provided under subsection (b)(3) for the
submission of a report through the department's Internet web site:
(1) the form must include fields in which the individual
submitting the report is to enter the individual's name and
address; and
(2) the department's Internet web site must be programmed
so as not to allow the submission of a report to the department
unless the fields referred to in subdivision (1) are filled in.
(f) This subsection applies to reports submitted after June 30,
2020. Upon the request of a person:
(1) to whom a report of a potential violation described in
subsection (a) refers; or
(2) who owns, occupies, or uses property to which a report of
a potential violation described in subsection (a) relates;
the department shall disclose to the person the identity of the
individual who made the report to the department unless the
individual's identity is excepted from disclosure under IC 5-14-3-4.
