

SENATE BILL No. 82

DIGEST OF SB 82 (Updated February 3, 2021 11:31 am - DI 104)

Citations Affected: IC 25-23.6.

Synopsis: Mental health diagnosis. Defines "mental health diagnosis" and sets forth requirements that must be met in order for certain licensed professionals to provide a mental health diagnosis. Requires certain mental health professionals who are making a mental health diagnosis and who determine that the patient has not been examined by a physician or an advanced practice registered nurse in the preceding 12 months to recommend to the patient that the patient schedule an examination by a physician at the earliest opportunity. Requires notation of that recommendation in the patient's medical record.

Effective: July 1, 2021.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning professions and occupations.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 25-23.6-1-5.6 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA
2	CODE AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS
3	[EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2021]: Sec. 5.6. (a) "Mental health diagnosis"
4	means the evaluation of mental, emotional, behavioral, and
5	addictive disorders and conditions by an individual who:
6	(1) uses accepted classifications, including the most current
7	version of:
8	(A) the American Psychiatric Association's Diagnostic and
9	Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders (DSM); and
0	(B) the International Classification of Diseases (ICD); and
1	(2) complies with:
2	(A) the education, training, experience, and licensure
3	requirements set forth in IC 25-23.6-11-4; and
4	(B) the individual's professional scope of practice.
5	(b) The term does not include a physical diagnosis.

1	JULY 1, 2021]: Sec. 5.9. (a) "Practice of clinical addiction counseling"				
2	means the providing of professional services that are delivered by a

5	knowledge and skill related to addictions and addictive behaviors				
6	including understanding addiction, knowledge of the treatment process				
7	application to practice, and professional readiness. The term includes				
8	(1) gathering information through structured interview screens				
9	using routine protocols and standardized clinical instruments;				
10	(2) using appraisal instruments as an aid in individualized				
11	treatment planning that the licensed clinical addiction counselor				
12	is qualified to employ because of:

24	SECTION 4. IC 25-23.6-1-7 IS AMENDED TO READ AS

26	and family therapy" means a specialty that:
27	(1) uses an applied understanding of the dynamics of marital,
28	relational, and family systems, and individual psychodynamics;
29	(2) uses counseling and psychotherapeutic techniques;
30	(3) evaluates provides a mental health diagnosis and treats
31	mental and emotional conditions, resolves intrapersonal and
32	interpersonal conflict, and changes perceptions, attitudes, and
33	behavior, all within the context of family, marital, and relational
34	systems, including the use of accepted evaluation classifications;
35	including classifications from the American Psychiatric
36	Association's Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental
37	Disorders (DSM-IV) as amended and supplemented, but only to
38	the extent of the counselor's education, training, experience, and
39	scope of practice as established by this article;
40	(4) uses individual, group, couple, sexual, family, and divorce

(5) uses appraisal instruments that evaluate individual, marital,



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therapy; and

1	relational, communicational, parent and child, and family
2	functioning that the marriage and family therapist is qualified to
3	employ by virtue of the counselor's education, training, and
4	experience.
5	The term does not include diagnosis (as defined in

13	intrapersonal, and interpersonal concerns;
14	(2) uses counseling to evaluate provide a mental health
15	diagnosis and treat emotional and mental problems and
16	conditions in a variety of settings, including mental and physical
17	health facilities, child and family service agencies, or private
18	practice, and including the use of accepted evaluation
19	classifications; including classifications from the American
20	Psychiatric Association's Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of
21	Mental Disorders (DSM-IV) as amended and supplemented, but
22	only to the extent of the counselor's education, training,
23	experience, and scope of practice as established by this article;
24	(3) administers and interprets appraisal instruments that the
25	mental health counselor is qualified to employ by virtue of the
26	counselor's education, training, and experience;

28	social, or vocational development;

30	(2) Training that includes diagnostic categories from the most
31	current version of the American Psychiatric Association's
32	Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Health Disorders
33	(DSM) and the most current version of the International
34	Classification of Diseases (ICD).
35	(3) Experience that includes at least one thousand (1,000)
36	hours of supervised practice by an appropriately licensed
37	supervisor, as determined by the board.
38	(4) Is licensed as at least one (1) of the following and meets the
39	scope of practice requirements of that profession:
40	(A) Clinical social worker licensed under IC 25-23.6-5.
41	(B) Marriage and family therapist licensed under
42	IC 25-23.6-8.
