SENATE BILL No. 84

DIGEST OF SB 84 (Updated January 12, 2022 12:12 pm - DI 104)

Citations Affected: IC 16-37.

Synopsis: Suicide and drug overdose death reporting. Provides that the state department of health (department) shall annually prepare a report concerning all suicide and overdose fatalities in Indiana that occurred during the preceding calendar year. Requires the report to include: (1) the number of fatalities that occurred in each county; (2) the number of fatalities that occurred during each month; (3) the age, sex, and race of each fatality victim; and (4) the method of suicide or overdose, including the type of weapon used. Provides that the first report must also include information from the 2020 calendar year. Requires the department to submit the report and an executive summary of the report to the general assembly and the governor.

Effective: Upon passage.

SENATE BILL No. 84

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning health.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1 SECTION 1. IC 16-37-5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE AS
2 A **NEW** CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE UPON
3 PASSAGE]:

4 **Chapter 5. Suicide and Overdose Fatality Reporting**

5 **Sec. 1. (a) Not later than November 30 of each year, the state**
6 **department shall prepare a report concerning all fatalities in**
7 **Indiana that are the result of suicide or overdose during the**
8 **preceding calendar year. The report must include the following**
9 **information:**

- 10 (1) **The number of fatalities that occurred in each county.**
11 (2) **The number of fatalities that occurred during each month.**
12 (3) **The age, sex, and race of each fatality victim.**
13 (4) **The number of fatalities by method of suicide or overdose,**
14 **including the type of weapon used, if applicable.**

15 (b) **The first report required by subsection (a) must also include**
16 **all fatalities in Indiana that are the result of suicide or overdose**
17 **during the 2020 calendar year.**

1 (c) Not later than November 30 of each year, the state
2 department shall submit the annual report required by subsection
3 (a), including an executive summary of the report, to the general
4 assembly and the governor. The report submitted to the general
5 assembly must be in an electronic format under IC 5-14-6.

6 SECTION 2. An emergency is declared for this act.
