DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 12-15-35.5-10.

Synopsis: Exemption from prior authorization. Provides that the Medicaid program and children's health insurance program may not require prior authorization for a medication that is approved by the federal Food and Drug Administration (FDA) for the mitigation of opioid withdrawal or approved by the FDA for the treatment of opioid use disorder.

Effective: July 1, 2023.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

5	(2) a managed care organization that has contracted with the
6	office of Medicaid policy and planning under this article; or
7	(3) a person that has contracted with a managed care
8	organization described in subdivision (2);
9	may not require prior authorization for a medication that is
10	approved by the federal Food and Drug Administration for the
11	mitigation of opioid withdrawal or approved by the federal Food
12	and Drug Administration for the treatment of opioid use disorder.
