

### SENATE BILL No. 91

DIGEST OF SB 91 (Updated February 18, 2021 9:43 am - DI 140)

Citations Affected: IC 10-17; noncode.

**Synopsis:** Hyperbaric oxygen treatment pilot program. Extends the expiration date of the hyperbaric oxygen treatment pilot program for veterans from June 30, 2021, to June 30, 2025. Provides that certain: (1) billing documentation; or (2) attendance documentation; may be used to authenticate the receipt of hyperbaric oxygen treatments for the purpose of payment approval by the department of veterans' affairs. Removes a provision that requires the state department of health to request proposals concerning hyperbaric oxygen treatment from certain geographic areas of Indiana. Specifies that a certain appropriation does not revert to the state general fund until July 1, 2025.

Effective: Upon passage; June 29, 2021.

## **SENATE BILL No. 91**

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning public safety and to make an appropriation.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. IC 10-17-13.5-6, AS AMENDED BY P.L.156-2019
SECTION 1, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
TUNE 29, 2021]: Sec. 6. (a) As used in this section, "hyperbaric oxygen
reatment" means treatment for traumatic brain injury or posttraumatic
stress disorder that is ordered by a health care provider and delivered
n a hyperbaric chamber.

- (b) The department shall establish a pilot program for the purpose of providing assistance for each provider that has been approved by the state department of health to provide diagnostic testing and hyperbaric oxygen treatment to veterans receiving treatment under section 4(b) of this chapter.
- (c) The state department of health shall issue a request for proposals to select up to five (5) providers that collectively represent the north, south, east, west, and central geographic areas of within Indiana to offer the treatment described in section 4(b) of this chapter.
- (d) An individual veteran is eligible to begin treatment if the service related event that caused the traumatic brain injury or posttraumatic



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1	stress disorder is documented by a licensed physician.
2	(e) An individual veteran may not be required to pay a co-pay under
3	the pilot program.
4	(f) A grant under the pilot program established under subsection (b)
5	may be provided only to the provider chosen by the state department of
6	health to provide diagnostic testing and hyperbaric oxygen treatment
7	to veterans.
8	(g) The state department of health, after consulting with the
9	department, shall adopt rules under IC 4-22-2 to implement section
10	4(b) of this chapter, including standards for the following:
l 1	(1) Determination by a provider that an individual is a veteran
12	eligible for participation in the pilot program.
13	(2) Determination by the state department of health that a
14	provider is eligible to participate in the pilot program, including:
15	(A) a requirement that the provider must maintain compliance
16	with applicable fire codes, treatment protocols, and state
17	department of health oversight; and
18	(B) other facility standards determined by the state department
19	of health.
20	(3) Treatment plan requirements, including the following:
21	(A) A provider's submission to the state department of health,
22 23 24	before providing hyperbaric oxygen treatment to a veteran, of
23	a treatment plan that includes:
	(i) a health care provider's prescription for hyperbaric
25 26 27	oxygen treatment;
26	(ii) verification by the provider that the veteran is eligible
	for participation in the pilot program and voluntarily accepts
28	treatment through the pilot program;
29	(iii) an estimate of the cost of the veteran's treatment; and
30	(iv) any other information required by the state department
31	of health.
32	(B) A reasonable time frame for:
33	(i) approval or disapproval by the state department of health
34	of a treatment plan described in clause (A); and
35	(ii) notice to the provider of approval or disapproval of the
36	treatment plan.
37	(C) Contingent on sufficient funding available in the fund,
38	approval of each treatment plan that meets the requirements
39	established by the state department of health under this
10	section.
<b>1</b> 1	(D) The sources of funding for the estimated treatment cost for
12	each veteran whose treatment plan is approved under this



section.

2	(4) Criteria for approval of payment for treatment that has been
3	verified by the state department of health to have been provided
4	under a treatment plan approved under subdivision (3), including:
5	(A) whether a drug or device used in the treatment plan has
6	been approved for any purpose by the federal Food and Drug
7	Administration; and
8	(B) health improvement verification of the veteran receiving
9	the treatment, as demonstrated through:
10	(i) standardized, independent pretreatment and
11	posttreatment neuropsychological testing; billing
12	documentation from the provider of the hyperbaric
13	oxygen therapy treatments; or
14	(ii) nationally accepted survey instruments; attendance
15	documentation signed by the provider and treatment
16	recipient attesting to the receipt of the prescribed
17	treatments.
18	(iii) neurological imaging; or
19	(iv) elinical examination; and
20	(C) receipt by the state department of health of pretreatment
21	and posttreatment evaluation documentation.
22	(5) Confidentiality of all individually identifiable patient
23	information of a veteran. However, subject to the requirements of
24	the federal Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act
25	and any other applicable medical record laws, all data and
26	information from which the identity of an individual veteran
27	cannot be reasonably ascertained must be available to the general
28	assembly, participating institutional review boards, participating
29	health care providers, medical researchers, and other
30	governmental agencies.
31	(h) A provider under this section, including a physician who
32	supervises treatment, shall bill the pilot program and be paid at cost out
33	of the grant amount awarded to the provider. No providers may profit
34	from services provided under the pilot program. Services offered under
35	the pilot program are provided as a service to veterans.
36	(i) Each provider shall quarterly file a status report concerning the
37	services provided by the provider under the pilot program with the
38	following:
39	(1) The department.
40	(2) The state department of health.
41	(j) At the conclusion of the pilot program, the department, in
42	collaboration with the state department of health, shall prepare a



1	written final report and transmit it to the following:
2	(1) The governor.
3	(2) The leadership of the legislative council in electronic format
4	under IC 5-14-6.
5	(3) The chairperson of the house committee on veterans affairs
6	and public safety.
7	(4) The chairperson of the senate committee on veterans affairs
8	and the military.
9	The report required under this subsection must be made available on
10	the department's Internet web site.
11	(k) This section expires <del>June 30, 2021.</del> <b>June 30, 2025.</b>
12	SECTION 2. P.L.156-2019, SECTION 2, IS AMENDED TO READ
13	AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE UPON PASSAGE]: (a) The following
14	definitions apply throughout this SECTION:
15	(1) "Department" refers to the Indiana department of veterans'
16	affairs.
17	(2) "Pilot program" refers to the pilot program established under
18	IC 10-17-13.5-6, as amended by this act, to provide assistance to
19	approved providers that furnish diagnostic testing and hyperbaric
20	oxygen treatment to veterans.
21	(b) Money appropriated to the department in P.L.217-2017,
22	SECTION 8, for purposes of the pilot program for state fiscal years
23	beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019, and remaining
24	unspent at the end of the state fiscal year ending June 30, 2019:
25	(1) remains available to the department for the purposes of the
26	pilot program; and
27	(2) does not revert to the state general fund.
28	(c) Money appropriated to the department for purposes of the pilot
29	program for state fiscal years beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June
30	30, 2019, may not be spent after June 30, <del>2021.</del> <b>2025.</b> Any money
31	appropriated to the department for the pilot program that remains
32	unspent after June 30, <del>2021,</del> <b>2025,</b> reverts to the state general fund.
33	(d) This SECTION expires July 1, <del>2021.</del> <b>2025.</b>
34	SECTION 3. An emergency is declared for this act.
