Synopsis: Possession of firearms by retired police officers. Provides that a retired law enforcement officer may possess a firearm on school property under certain conditions.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning criminal law and procedure.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 35-47-9-1, AS AMENDED BY P.L.107-2019,
2	SECTION 11, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3	JULY 1, 2023]: Sec. 1. (a) This chapter does not apply to the following:

5	(A) federal;
6	(B) state; or
7	(C) local;
8	law enforcement officer.
9	(2) A person who is a retired law enforcement officer and
10	who:
11	(A) served as a law enforcement officer for not less than
12	ten (10) years;
13	(B) possesses a photographic identification card issued
14	under IC 35-47-15-4; and
15	(C) meets annual training and qualification standards that
16	are established by the retired officer's law enforcement
17	agency.



1	(2) (3) A person who may legally possess a firearm and who has
2	been authorized by:
3	(A) a school board (as defined by IC 20-26-9-4); or
4	(B) the body that administers a charter school established
5	under IC 20-24;
6	to carry a firearm in or on school property.
7	(3) (4) Except as provided in subsection (b) or (c), a person who:
8	(A) may legally possess a firearm; and
9	(B) possesses the firearm in a motor vehicle.
10	(4) (5) A person who is a school resource officer, as defined in
11	IC 20-26-18.2-1.
12	(5) (6) Except as provided in subsection (b) or (c), a person who:
13	(A) may legally possess a firearm; and
14	(B) possesses only a firearm that is:
15	(i) locked in the trunk of the person's motor vehicle;
16	(ii) kept in the glove compartment of the person's locked
17	motor vehicle; or
18	(iii) stored out of plain sight in the person's locked motor
19	vehicle.
20	(6) (7) A person who:
21	(A) may legally possess a firearm; and
22	(B) possesses a firearm on school property in connection with
23	or while:
24	(i) attending a worship service or religious ceremony
25	conducted at a house of worship located on the school
26	property; or
27	(ii) carrying out the person's official duties at a house of
28	worship located on the school property, if the person is
29	employed by or a volunteer at the house of worship.
30	This subdivision does not affect the right of a property owner to
31	prohibit, in whole or in part, the possession of a firearm on a
32	property where a school or house of worship is located.
33	(b) For purposes of subsection $\frac{(a)(3)}{(a)(4)}$ and $\frac{(a)(5)}{(a)(6)}$, $\frac{(a)(6)}{(a)(6)}$, a
34	person does not include a person who is:
35	(1) enrolled as a student in any high school except if the person is
36	a high school student and is a member of a shooting sports team
37	and the school's principal has approved the person keeping a
38	firearm concealed in the person's motor vehicle on the days the
39	person is competing or practicing as a member of a shooting
40	sports team; or
41	(2) a former student of the school if the person is no longer
42	enrolled in the school due to a disciplinary action within the



1	previous twenty-four (24) months.
2	(c) For purposes of subsection $\frac{(a)(3)}{(a)(4)}$ and $\frac{(a)(5)}{(a)(6)}$, a
3	motor vehicle does not include a motor vehicle owned, leased, or
4	controlled by a school or school district unless the person who
5	possesses the firearm is authorized by the school or school district to
6	possess a firearm.
