DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 5-10.2-10-27.

Synopsis: Divestment from states that sponsor terror. Provides that a country determined to be a state sponsor of terror remains subject to the application of Indiana's mandatory divestment statutes until the date the Secretary of State of the United States removes the country from its official list of state sponsors of terrorism. (Current law provides that the country remains subject to the statutes until the earlier of the date of the removal from the list or the date of a congressional or presidential declaration that state mandatory divestment policies interfere with the conduct of foreign policy of the United States.)

Effective: Upon passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning pensions.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

5	that country on the earlier of the following:
6	(1) The date the Secretary of State of the United States removes
7	the country from its official list of state sponsors of terrorism.
8	(2) The date Congress or the President of the United States
9	through legislation or executive order, declares that mandatory
10	divestment of the type provided for in this chapter interferes with
11	the conduct of foreign policy of the United States.
12	SECTION 2. An emergency is declared for this act.
