



SENATE BILL No. 153

DIGEST OF SB 153 (Updated January 30, 2017 1:47 pm - DI 97)

Citations Affected: Noncode.

Synopsis: Drug and alcohol treatment report. Requires the state department of health, with the assistance of the department of administration and the secretary of family and social services, to report to the legislative council concerning the: (1) number of hospital beds currently available in Indiana; (2) location and physical description of state owned buildings that are currently available, or expected to be available before July 1, 2018, for conversion and use; and (3) feasibility of using currently unused hospital and health care facility beds; for drug and alcohol detoxification, treatment, and rehabilitation.

Effective: July 1, 2017.

SENATE BILL No. 153

A BILL FOR AN ACT concerning state offices and administration.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2017] (a) Not later than
2	January 1, 2018, the state department of health, with the assistance
3	of the department of administration and office of the secretary of
4	family and social services, shall report to the legislative council in
5	an electronic format under IC 5-14-6 the following:
6	(1) The number, location, and availability of beds in Indiana
7	that are used for drug and alcohol detoxification, treatment,
8	and rehabilitation.
9	(2) The location and physical description of state owned
10	buildings that are currently available, or expected to be
11	available before July 1, 2018, and are appropriate for
12	conversion and use to provide beds in Indiana for drug and
13	alcohol detoxification, treatment, and rehabilitation.
14	(3) The feasibility of using currently unused hospital and
15	health care facility beds for drug and alcohol detoxification,
16	treatment, and rehabilitation, including the following:
17	(A) Licensure, regulatory, or statutory barriers that would
18	prevent or affect use of the currently unused beds for drug



1	and alcohol detoxification, treatment, and rehabilitation.
2	(B) Possible methods of payment and reimbursement for
3	drug and alcohol detoxification, treatment, and
4	rehabilitation provided in a hospital or health care facility.
5	(b) This SECTION expires July 1, 2018.

SENATE MOTION

Page 1, between lines 13 and 14, begin a new line block indented and insert:

- "(3) The feasibility of using currently unused hospital and health care facility beds for drug and alcohol detoxification, treatment, and rehabilitation, including the following:
 - (A) Licensure, regulatory, or statutory barriers that would prevent or affect use of the currently unused beds for drug and alcohol detoxification, treatment, and rehabilitation.
 - (B) Possible methods of payment and reimbursement for drug and alcohol detoxification, treatment, and rehabilitation provided in a hospital or health care facility."
