

ENGROSSED SENATE BILL No. 158

DIGEST OF SB 158 (Updated February 26, 2018 11:30 am - DI 84)

Citations Affected: IC 25-1.

Synopsis: Scleral tattooing. Defines "scleral tattooing". Prohibits the act of performing or offering to perform scleral tattooing. Provides an exception for the act of a licensed health care professional when the act is performed in the scope of the health care professional's practice. Provides that the attorney general: (1) has authority to receive and investigate complaints regarding violations of the statute; (2) may seek civil penalties of up to \$10,000 per violation of the statute; and (3) may seek an injunction to restrain a person from continuing to violate the statute.

Effective: July 1, 2018.

ENGROSSED SENATE BILL No. 158

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning professions and occupations.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 25-1-19 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE AS
2	A NEW CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
3	1, 2018]:
4	Chapter 19. Scleral Tattooing
5	Sec. 1. "Scleral tattooing" means the practice of producing an
6	indelible mark or figure on the human eye by scarring or inserting
7	a pigment on, in, or under:
8	(1) the fornix conjunctiva;
9	(2) the bulbar conjunctiva;
10	(3) the ocular conjunctiva; or
11	(4) another ocular surface;
12	using needles, scalpels, or other related equipment.
13	Sec. 2. (a) Except as provided in subsection (b), a person may
14	not perform or offer to perform scleral tattooing on another
15	person.
16	(b) This section does not apply to an act of a health care
17	professional (as defined in IC 16-27-2-1) licensed under IC 25 when



1	the act is performed in the scope of the health care professional's
2	practice.
3	Sec. 3. A person who violates this chapter is subject to a civil
4	penalty not to exceed ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) for each
5	violation, as determined by the court.
6	Sec. 4. (a) The attorney general may receive, investigate, and
7	prosecute complaints against alleged violators of this chapter.
8	(b) The attorney general may institute and conduct an action in
9	the name of the state of Indiana for any of the following:
10	(1) An injunction in any circuit or superior court of Indiana
11	for injunctive relief to restrain a person from continuing any
12	activity that violates this chapter.
13	(2) The assessment and recovery of civil penalties provided in
14	section 3 of this chapter.
15	Sec. 5. The attorney general shall be reimbursed through civil
16	penalties collected under this chapter for the costs incurred in
17	providing the services described in section 4 of this chapter. Any
18	remaining funds shall be deposited in the state general fund.
