

### SENATE BILL No. 158

DIGEST OF SB 158 (Updated February 14, 2019 2:51 pm - DI 128)

Citations Affected: IC 21-22.

Synopsis: Indiana youth service program. Provides that Ivy Tech Community College (Ivy Tech) shall develop a proposal to establish the Indiana youth service program (program) to provide high school graduates with the opportunity to learn various skills and participate in service at host sites throughout Indiana. Provides that Ivy Tech may seek input on the program from the department of workforce development, the commission for higher education, and the legislative services agency. Provides that Ivy Tech shall present the proposed program, including costs of administration, to the budget committee and the general assembly for review and consideration not later than December 1, 2019.

Effective: July 1, 2019.

## **SENATE BILL No. 158**

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning labor and safety.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 21-22-7 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE AS
2	A NEW CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
3	1, 2019]:
4	Chapter 7. Indiana Youth Service Program
5	Sec. 1. This chapter applies to a student entering grade 12 in
6	2020 and thereafter.
7	Sec. 2. As used in this chapter, "eligible institution" refers to a
8	postsecondary educational institution that:
9	(1) operates in Indiana;
0	(2) is either operated by the state or operated as a nonprofit;
1	(3) operates an organized program of postsecondary
2	education leading to a technical certificate, nursing diploma,
3	or associate or baccalaureate degree; and
4	(4) is accredited by:
5	(A) a recognized regional accrediting agency;
6	(B) the board for proprietary education under
7	IC 21-18.5-6;



1	(C) the Indiana state board of nursing; or
2	(D) the department of workforce development under
3	IC 22-4.1-21.
4	Sec. 3. As used in this chapter, "program" refers to the
5	proposed Indiana youth service program established by section 4
6	of this chapter.
7	Sec. 4. Not later than December 1, 2019, Ivy Tech Community
8	College shall develop a proposal to establish the Indiana youth
9	service program to do the following:
10	(1) Encourage young people to remain in Indiana after
11	graduating from high school.
12	(2) Provide program participants with the skills that will
13	enable them to successfully make the transition from high
14	school to:
15	(A) an institution of higher education; or
16	(B) the workforce.
17	(3) Provide a model of social engagement for young people,
18	and encourage relationships among young people across
19	diverse communities.
20	(4) Encourage a culture of civic participation and promote
21	democracy.
22	Ivy Tech Community College shall administer the program.
23	Sec. 5. (a) In developing the program, Ivy Tech Community
24	College shall provide for the inclusion of a selection committee that
25	shall review applications and select potential participants for the
26	program as part of a competitive application process. The selection
27	committee shall consist of the following nine (9) members:
28	(1) The president of Ivy Tech Community College or the
29	president's designee, who shall serve as chair.
30	(2) The commissioner of the department of workforce
31	development or the commissioner's designee.
32	(3) The commissioner of the commission for higher education
33	or the commissioner's designee.
34	(4) An executive assistant to the governor designated by the
35	governor.
36	(5) One (1) member of the house of representatives appointed
37	by the speaker of the house of representatives.
38	(6) One (1) member of the house of representatives appointed
39	by the minority leader of the house of representatives.
40	(7) One (1) member of the senate appointed by the president
41	pro tempore of the senate.
42	(8) One (1) member of the senate appointed by the minority



1	leader of the senate.
2	(9) A representative of a nonprofit organization that
3	specializes in youth services, appointed by the governor.
4	(b) The chair of the selection committee shall establish the
5	meeting times and dates for the selection committee.
6	(c) Each member of the selection committee who is a member of
7	the general assembly is a nonvoting member.
8	(d) Each member of the selection committee who is not a state
9	employee is entitled to the minimum salary per diem provided by
10	IC 4-10-11-2.1(b). The member is also entitled to reimbursement
11	for traveling expenses as provided under IC 4-13-1-4 and other
12	expenses actually incurred in connection with the member's duties
13	as provided in the state policies and procedures established by the
14	Indiana department of administration and approved by the budget
15	agency.
16	(e) Each member of the selection committee who is a state
17	employee but who is not a member of the general assembly is
18	entitled to reimbursement for traveling expenses as provided under
19	IC 4-13-1-4 and other expenses actually incurred in connection
20	with the member's duties as provided in the state policies and
21	procedures established by the Indiana department of
22	administration and approved by the budget agency.
23	(f) Each member of the selection committee who is a member of
24	the general assembly is entitled to receive the same per diem,
25	mileage, and travel allowances paid to legislative members of
26	interim study committees established by the legislative council or
27	the legislative services agency.
28	(g) The expenses of the selection committee shall be paid from
29	the Indiana youth service program fund established under section
30	11 of this chapter.
31	Sec. 6. (a) Except as provided in subsection (b), the selection
32	committee described in section 5 of this chapter may consider a
33	student's application only if the student meets the following
34	requirements:
35	(1) Is a resident of Indiana.
36	(2) Is entering grade 12 at a:
37	(A) public school, including a charter school;
38	(B) nonpublic school that is accredited by either the state
39	board of education or a national or regional accreditation
40	agency that is recognized by the state board of education;
41	or
42	(C) nonaccredited nonpublic school.



1	(3) Agrees, in writing, together with the student's custodial
2	parents or guardian, that the student will graduate from a
3	secondary school located in Indiana that meets the admission
4	criteria of an eligible institution.
5	(b) In addition to a student who meets the minimum
6	requirements under subsection (a), the selection committee may
7	consider a student who:
8	(1) before or during grade 11 is placed by or with the consent
9	of the department of child services, by a court order, or by a
10	child placing agency in:
11	(A) a foster family home;
12	(B) the home of a relative or other unlicensed caretaker;
13	(C) a child caring institution; or
14	(D) a group home;
15	(2) meets the requirements in subsection (a)(1) through (a)(2);
16	and
17	(3) agrees in writing, together with the student's caseworker
18	(as defined in IC 31-9-2-11) or legal guardian, to the
19	conditions set forth in subsection (a)(3).
20	(c) The selection committee shall consider an applicant's
21	curiosity, work ethic, and enthusiasm for serving others in
22	determining whether the applicant may be selected for
23	consideration as a program participant.
24	(d) In selecting potential program participants, the selection
25	committee shall strive to ensure that each group of program
26	participants embodies Indiana's socioeconomic, geographic, racial,
27	religious, ethnic, and political diversity.
28	Sec. 7. (a) As part of the program under section 4 of this
29	chapter, Ivy Tech Community College shall select entities to serve
30	as service host sites for program participants. Ivy Tech
31	Community College shall consider:
32	(1) the entity's capacity to engage participants in meaningful
33	work; and
34	(2) the entity's ability to ensure a variety of experiences for
35	participants;
36	when selecting an entity as a service host site.
37	(b) Ivy Tech Community College may also consider the entity's
38	ability to contribute to the costs of hosting program participants,
39	including housing costs, if needed.
40	(c) In considering the criteria set forth in subsections (a) and (b),

of entities as service host sites, including but not limited to:

1	(1) private employers in the areas of:
2	(A) advanced manufacturing;
3	(B) building and construction;
4	(C) health and life sciences;
5	(D) information technology and business services;
6	(E) transportation and logistics; and
7	(F) agriculture;
8	(2) nonprofit, faith based, and community organizations;
9	(3) school corporations and charter schools; and
10	(4) political subdivisions.
11	Sec. 8. (a) A program participant may be released from
12	completing a term of service for compelling personal
13	circumstances, as determined by the department, or for cause.
14	(b) Compelling personal circumstances include those
15	circumstances beyond the program participant's control,
16	including:
17	(1) a participant's disability or serious illness;
18	(2) a family member's disability, serious illness, or death; or
19	(3) conditions attributable to the program or otherwise
20	unforeseeable and beyond the program participant's control,
21	such as a natural disaster, a strike, or the relocation of a
22	spouse.
23	(c) Compelling personal circumstances do not include leaving
24	the program:
25	(1) to enroll in school;
26	(2) to obtain employment; or
27	(3) because of dissatisfaction with the program.
28	(d) A release for cause encompasses any circumstance other
29	than compelling personal circumstances that warrants an
30	individual's release from completing a term of service. The
31	department must release for cause a program participant who is
32	convicted of a felony or for the sale or distribution of a controlled
33	substance (as defined in IC 35-48-1-9) during the participant's
34	term of service.
35	Sec. 9. Ivy Tech Community College may adopt policies to
36	implement the program under this chapter, and may seek input
37	about the program from other entities, including but not limited to:
38	(1) the department of workforce development;
39	(2) the commission for higher education; and
40	(3) the legislative services agency.
41	Sec. 10. In developing the proposal, Ivy Tech Community

College shall explore the possibility of:

1	(1) accessing federal or other grant funding for the program;
2	and
3	(2) awarding program participants with academic credit,
4	certification, or scholarships for service in the program.
5	Sec. 11. Not later than December 1, 2019, Ivy Tech Community
6	College shall submit the proposed program, including the
7	projected costs of administration, to the budget committee
8	established by IC 4-12-1-3 and, in an electronic format under
9	IC 5-14-6, to the general assembly for review and consideration.
10	Sec. 12. This chapter expires July 1, 2024.

- (f) Each member of the selection committee who is a member of the general assembly is entitled to receive the same per diem, mileage, and travel allowances paid to legislative members of interim study committees established by the legislative council or the legislative services agency.
- (g) The expenses of the selection committee shall be paid from the Indiana youth service program fund established under section 13 of this chapter.".
