DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 25-23-1-12.

Synopsis: Licensed practical nurses. Removes the requirement that a state accredited program of practical nursing only accepts students who have a high school diploma or its equivalent. Requires a person to have earned a high school diploma or its equivalent to qualify for a license to practice as a licensed practical nurse.

Effective: July 1, 2025.

SENATE BILL No. 176

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning professions and occupations.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 25-23-1-12, AS AMENDED BY P.L.17-2024,
2	SECTION 18, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3	JULY 1, 2025]: Sec. 12. (a) A person who applies to the board for a
4	license to practice as a licensed practical nurse must:
5	(1) not have been convicted of:
6	(A) an act which would constitute a ground for disciplinary
7	sanction under IC 25-1-9; or
8	(B) a crime that has a direct bearing on the person's ability to
9	practice competently;
10	(2) have completed:
11	(A) the prescribed curriculum and met the graduation
12	requirements of a state accredited program of practical nursing
13	that only accepts students who have a high school diploma or
14	its equivalent, as determined by the board; or
15	(B) the prescribed curriculum and graduation requirements of
16	a nursing education program in a foreign country that is
17	substantially equivalent to a board approved program as



1	determined by the board. The board may by rule adopted under
2	IC 4-22-2 require an applicant under this subsection to
3	successfully complete an examination approved by the board
4	to measure the applicant's qualifications and background in the
5	practice of nursing and proficiency in the English language;
6	and
7	(3) be physically and mentally capable of, and professionally
8	competent to, safely engage in the practice of practical nursing as
9	determined by the board; and
10	(4) have earned a high school diploma or its equivalent.
11	An applicant meets the English proficiency requirement under
12	subdivision (2) if the applicant passes an English course as certified in
13	the transcript from the board's approved nursing education program or
14	submits proof of passing the National Council Licensure Examination
15	(NCLEX) that was taken in only the English language.
16	(b) The applicant must pass an examination in such subjects as the
17	board may determine.
18	(c) The board may issue a temporary licensed practical nurse permit
19	to practice as a licensed practical nurse applicant to a person who has
20	initially applied for license by examination, after the board receives the
21	necessary materials to determine compliance with subsection (a). The
22	temporary licensed practical nurse permit is valid until the earlier of six
23	(6) months after issuance or the licensed practical nurse applicant's
24	examination results under subsection (b) are received. If the licensed
25	practical nurse applicant does not receive a passing score on the first
26	examination under subsection (b), the temporary licensed practical
27	nurse permit is no longer valid.
28	(d) A licensed practical nurse applicant must:
29	(1) practice under the supervision of a licensed practical nurse or
30	registered nurse; and
31	(2) use the abbreviation "LPNG" after the licensed practical nurse
32	graduate's name.
33	(e) The board may issue by endorsement a license to practice as a
34	licensed practical nurse to an applicant who has been licensed as a
35	licensed practical nurse, by examination, under the laws of another
36	state if the applicant presents proof satisfactory to the board that, at the
37	time of application for an Indiana license by endorsement, the applicant
38	possesses credentials and qualifications that are substantially
39	equivalent to requirements in Indiana for licensure by examination. The
40	board may specify by rule what shall constitute substantial equivalence
41	under this subsection.

(f) The board shall issue by endorsement or examination a license

38	(i) Any person who holds a license to practice as a licensed practical
39	nurse in Indiana or under IC 25-42 may use the title "Licensed Practical
10	Nurse" and the abbreviation "L.P.N.". No other person shall practice or
11	advertise as or assume the title of licensed practical nurse or use the
12	abbreviation of "L.P.N." or any other words, letters, signs, or figures to



1 indicate that the person using them is a licensed practical nurse.
