## SENATE BILL No. 186

### DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

**Citations Affected:** IC 7.1-3-1.1.

**Synopsis:** Escrow periods for alcoholic beverage permits. Provides that a permit may be escrowed with the alcohol and tobacco commission (commission) for an initial period of 48 months, to which may be added two 12 month extensions. (Current law provides for an initial 24 month period followed by three 12 month extensions.) Specifies that an escrowed permit reverts to the commission if the commission has a reasonable basis to believe that the escrow of the permit does not comply with representations made by the permit holder.

Effective: July 1, 2020.

### SENATE BILL No. 186

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning alcohol and tobacco.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

2 3	(b) If the permit has not expired or reverted to the commission, a
4	permit holder may withdraw a permit that is deposited with the
5	commission and make the permit active at any time before the term of
6	deposit expires, subject to any requirements of the commission.
7	SECTION 2. IC 7.1-3-1.1-3, AS ADDED BY P.L.285-2019,
8	SECTION 15, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
9	JULY 1, 2020]: Sec. 3. (a) A permit reverts to the commission if:
10	(1) the permit is not active and a term of deposit under section
11	2(a) of this chapter expires without the commission approving an
12	extension of the term; and or
13	(2) the permit is not active. after providing the permit holder
14	with notice and an opportunity to appear at a public hearing
15	and show cause otherwise, the commission has a reasonable
16	basis to believe the deposit of the permit does not comply with
17	the permit holder's representations made at the public
18	meeting of the commission under section 4 of this chapter.
19	(b) In addition to the notice provided under IC 7.1-3-1-3, at least
20	ninety (90) days before the date that a term of deposit expires, the
21	commission shall provide written notice to the permit holder of the date
22	that:
23	(1) the term of deposit expires; and
24	(2) the permit will revert to the commission if:
25	(A) the permit is not active; or
26	(B) an extension of the term of deposit has not been approved
27	by the commission.
