## SENATE BILL No. 215

## DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

**Citations Affected:** IC 20-30-5-7; IC 20-34-3-4.

**Synopsis:** Mental health education and screenings. Requires a school corporation's health education curriculum to include mental health wellness education. Provides that the governing body of a school corporation may provide mental health screenings to students. Provides that the department of education shall provide a school corporation with resources regarding mental health wellness upon request by the school corporation.

Effective: July 1, 2022.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

31	(1) The number of students who took the naturalization

33	(2) The number of students who passed the naturalization
34	examination described in subsection (a)(3) by a score of not less
35	than sixty percent (60%) on their first attempt.
36	(3) The pass rate of the naturalization examination regarding the
37	students who passed as described in subdivision (2).
38	(e) Not more than thirty (30) days after the department reports to the
39	general assembly the information under subsection (d), the department

18, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1
2022]: Sec. 4. (a) The governing body of a school corporation may
provide for the inspection of students by a school physician to
determine whether any child suffers from disease, disability, decayed
teeth, or other defects that may reduce the student's efficiency or
prevent the student from receiving the full benefit of the student's
school work.

(b) The governing body of a school corporation may provide mental health screenings to students. The department shall provide a school corporation with resources regarding mental health wellness upon request by the school corporation.
