DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 12-20.

Synopsis: Township homeless assistance. Beginning July 1, 2022: (1) requires (rather than allows) a township trustee to place a homeless individual temporarily in a county home or provide temporary township assistance; and (2) requires the township trustees within a county to collaborate and prepare a list of public and private resources available to the homeless population that is distributed and published on the county's Internet web site not later than March 1 of each year.

Effective: July 1, 2022.
