

## **SENATE BILL No. 225**

DIGEST OF SB 225 (Updated January 17, 2024 1:17 pm - DI 55)

Citations Affected: IC 9-26.

**Synopsis:** Exchange of insurance information after accident. Provides that a law enforcement officer present at the scene of an accident shall ensure that each operator complies with the duties required of an operator of a motor vehicle after an accident regardless of the apparent extent of the total property damage resulting from the accident.

Effective: July 1, 2024.

## **SENATE BILL No. 225**

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning motor vehicles.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. IC 9-26-2-1, AS AMENDED BY P.L.88-2022,
SECTION 2, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
JULY 1, 2024]: Sec. 1. (a) A law enforcement officer shall investigate
each motor vehicle accident that results in any of the following:

- (1) The injury or death of a person.
- (2) Total property damage to an apparent extent of at least two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500).
- (b) If the apparent extent of the total property damage is less than the amount in subsection (a)(2), A law enforcement officer present at the scene of an accident shall ensure that each operator is in compliance with the requirements of IC 9-26-1-1.1, regardless of the apparent extent of the total property damage.

SECTION 2. IC 9-26-2-4, AS AMENDED BY P.L.88-2022, SECTION 3, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2024]: Sec. 4. (a) A law enforcement officer shall enforce IC 9-21 and IC 9-25 against the parties to a motor vehicle accident on private property if the accident:

(1) occurs on commercial or other private property that is open to
the public; and
(2) results in:
(A) personal injury or death; or
(B) property damage to an apparent extent greater than two
thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500).
(b) If the apparent extent of the total property damage is less than
the amount in subsection (a)(2)(B), A law enforcement officer present
at the scene of an accident shall ensure that each operator is in
compliance with the requirements of IC 9-26-1-1.1, regardless of the
apparent extent of the total property damage.
(c) This section does not affect the power of a local government unit
to contract with the owner or lessee of a shopping center or private
business property under IC 9-21-18-4.
