DIGEST OF SB 241 (Updated February 14, 2024 12:36 pm - DI 148)

Citations Affected: IC 14-22.

Synopsis: Taking bobcats. Requires the department of natural resources to establish and implement a season to take bobcats not later than July 1, 2025.

Effective: July 1, 2024.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning natural and cultural resources.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:
