



SENATE BILL No. 247

DIGEST OF SB 247 (Updated January 24, 2022 3:38 pm - DI 143)

Citations Affected: IC 10-19.

Synopsis: Report on 911 and regionalized trauma systems. Requires the department of homeland security, the state department of health, the integrated public safety commission, and the statewide 911 board to make recommendations before November 1, 2022, to the general assembly regarding: (1) improving emergency medical services response through increased interoperability of the 911 system; and (2) the effectiveness of regionalized trauma systems and the systems' impact on patient ears impact on patient care.

Effective: July 1, 2022.

SENATE BILL No. 247

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning public safety.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 10-19-2.1-2 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
2	AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
3	1, 2022]: Sec. 2. (a) Not later than October 31, 2022, the
4	department, the state department of health, integrated public
5	safety commission established by IC 5-26-2-1, and the statewide
6	911 board established by IC 36-8-16.7-24 shall develop and submit
7	recommendations regarding:
8	(1) ways that the 911 system can increase interoperability to
9	better facilitate an emergency medical services (as defined in
10	IC 16-18-2-110) response for the closest and most appropriate
11	source; and
12	(2) the effectiveness of regionalized trauma systems and the
13	impact of regionalized trauma systems on patient care;
14	to the executive director of the legislative services agency for
15	distribution to the members of the general assembly. The report
16	submitted to the executive director of the legislative services
17	agency must be in an electronic format under IC 5-14-6.



1	(b) In developing recommendations, the department, state
2	department of health, integrated public safety commission
3	established by IC 5-26-2-1, and statewide 911 board may consult
4	stakeholders, including:
5	(1) emergency medical services providers (IC 16-41-10-1);
6	(2) fire departments;
7	(3) hospitals or other emergency medical facilities; and
8	(4) local governments.
9	(c) This section expires July 1, 2023.
