## **SENATE BILL No. 291**

DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 5-35.

**Synopsis:** Anatomical gift inquiries. Requires a state agency, during a transaction that involves the disclosure of certain personal information, to ask an individual if the individual would like to register as the donor of an anatomical gift. Requires a state agency to offer a state employee an opportunity to register as a donor of an anatomical gift: (1) during the state employee's onboarding process; and (2) on an annual basis, during the state agency's employee benefits enrollment period.

Effective: July 1, 2025.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning state and local administration.

### Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

As used in this article, "state employee" means an 12 employee of a state agency. 13 **Chapter 2. Anatomical Gift Inquiry During Public Transactions** 14 Sec. 1. (a) During a public transaction, a state agency must ask 15 an individual if the individual desires to register to become a donor 16 of an anatomical gift. 17 (b) If an individual responds in the affirmative to the question 18 posed in subsection (a), the state agency must process the 19 individual's registration in the donor registry not later than the 20 end of the next business day. 21 (c) If an individual responds in the negative to the question 22 posed in subsection (a), the state agency may not alter, update, or 23 make any changes to the individual's existing anatomical gift donor 24 registration status. 25 Sec. 2. A state agency must incorporate the anatomical gift 26 inquiry in section 1(a) of this chapter into its standard public 27 transaction processes by using existing forms, electronic systems, 28 verbal questioning, or other transaction methods, including kiosks, 29 online portals, and in-person interactions, as applicable. 30 Sec. 3. (a) Not later than December 31, 2025, a state agency must 31 submit an implementation plan for the anatomical gift inquiry in 32 section 1(a) of this chapter to the donor registry. 33 (b) Not later than December 31, 2027, a state agency must 34 implement the plan required under subsection (a). 35 Chapter 3. Anatomical Gift Inquiry for State Employees 36 Sec. 1. (a) Beginning July 1, 2025, a state agency must provide 37 a state employee the opportunity to register to become a donor of 38 an anatomical gift: 39 (1) during the state employee's onboarding process; and 40 (2) on an annual basis, during the state agency's employee 41 benefits enrollment period. 42 (b) If a state employee elects to register under subsection (a), the



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- state agency must process the state employee's registration in the donor registry not later than the end of the next business day.



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
