# **SENATE BILL No. 301**

#### DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

**Citations Affected:** IC 12-10-17.1-12; IC 16-27-2-4; IC 22-1-5-13.

**Synopsis:** Criminal history checks for home health workers. Provides that an expanded criminal history check may be used instead of certain background checks and criminal history checks for home health care workers. Prohibits an expanded criminal history check to include certain criminal history information.

Effective: July 1, 2018.

### SENATE BILL No. 301

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning health.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 12-10-17.1-12, AS ADDED BY P.L.141-2006,
2	SECTION 44, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3	JULY 1, 2018]: Sec. 12. (a) The division shall register an individual
4	who provides the following:
5	(1) A personal resume containing information concerning the
6	individual's qualifications, work experience, and any credentials
7	the individual may hold. The individual must certify that the
8	information contained in the resume is true and accurate.
9	(2) The individual's:
10	(A) limited criminal history check from the Indiana central
11	repository for criminal history information under IC 10-13-3;
12	(B) expanded criminal history check under IC 20-26-2-1.5;
13	or
14	(C) criminal history check from another source allowed by
15	law.
16	(3) If applicable, the individual's state nurse aide registry report
17	from the state department of health. This subdivision does not



1	require an individual to be a nurse aide.
2	(4) Three (3) letters of reference.
3	(5) A registration fee. The division shall establish the amount of
4	the registration fee.
5	(6) Proof that the individual is at least eighteen (18) years of age.
6	(7) Any other information required by the division.
7	(b) A registration is valid for two (2) years. A personal services
8	attendant may renew the personal services attendant's registration by
9	updating any information in the file that has changed and by paying the
10	fee required under subsection (a)(5). The limited criminal history check
11	and report required under subsection (a)(2) and (a)(3) must be updated
12	every two (2) years.
13	(c) The division and any organization designated under section 11
14	of this chapter shall maintain a file for each personal services attendant
15	that contains:
16	(1) comments related to the provision of attendant care services
17	submitted by an individual in need of self-directed in-home care
18	who has employed the personal services attendant; and
19	(2) the items described in subsection (a)(1) through (a)(4).
20	(d) Upon request, the division shall provide to an individual in need
21	of self-directed in-home care the following:
22	(1) Without charge, a list of personal services attendants who are
23	registered with the division and available within the requested
24	geographic area.
25	(2) A copy of the information of a specified personal services
26	attendant who is on file with the division under subsection (c).
27	The division may charge a fee for shipping, handling, and copying
28	expenses.
29	(e) The limited criminal history check requirement described in
30	subsection (a)(2) may be satisfied by fulfilling the components of an
31	expanded criminal history check under IC 20-26-2-1.5 and is
32	subject to the conditions described in IC 16-27-2-4(c).
33	SECTION 2. IC 16-27-2-4, AS AMENDED BY P.L.51-2016,
34	SECTION 5, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
35	JULY 1, 2018]: Sec. 4. (a) A person who operates a home health
36	agency under IC 16-27-1 or a personal services agency under
37	IC 16-27-4 shall apply, not more than three (3) business days after the
38	date that an employee begins to provide services in a patient's
39	temporary or permanent residence, for a copy of the employee's
40	national criminal history background check or expanded criminal
41	history check.

(b) A home health agency or personal services agency may not



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1	employ a person to provide services in a patient's or client's temporary
2	or permanent residence for more than three (3) business days without
3	applying for a national criminal history background check or an
4	expanded criminal history check.
5	(c) A person's expanded criminal history check may not include:
6	(1) a person's information when the person was less than
7	eighteen (18) years of age; or
8	(2) information that is restricted by a state where the person
9	previously resided.
10	SECTION 3. IC 22-1-5-13, AS ADDED BY P.L.212-2005,
11	SECTION 19, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
12	JULY 1, 2018]: Sec. 13. (a) A placement agency:
13	(1) must provide a consumer with a consumer notice each time a
14	home care services worker is placed in the home of the consumer;
15	and
16	(2) is not required to provide a consumer notice when a new or
17	different home care services worker is substituting for the regular
18	home care services worker placed with the consumer.
19	(b) Before a placement agency places a home care services worker
20	with a consumer, the home care services worker must provide the
21	placement agency with a copy of the individual's:
22	(1) limited criminal history from the central repository for
23	criminal history information under IC 10-13-3; or
24	(2) expanded criminal history check, as defined in
25	IC 20-26-2-1.5, subject to the conditions described in
26	IC 16-27-2-4(c).
27	The home care services worker is responsible for the fees required
28	under IC 10-13-3-30 or the cost of an expanded criminal history
29	check and must annually obtain an updated limited criminal history or
30	expanded criminal history check. A copy of the home care services
31	worker's limited criminal history or expanded criminal history check
32	must be made available to the consumer.
